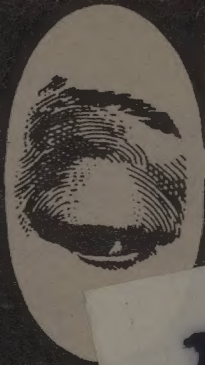
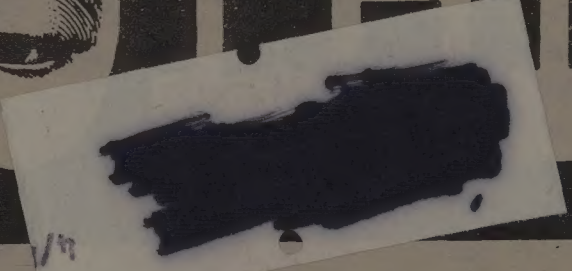

THE NEW LEFT AS AMERICAN AS APPLE PIE

When H. Rapp Brown made his famous statements, after the Washington D.C. riots of 1968, that violence was as American as apple pie, people were either astonished or amused by his arrogance. His statement more than suggested that he and those who perpetrated the violence were historically justified in doing so. It was as if America's scars had suddenly come to the surface. In an atmosphere of turmoil, the counter cry for law and order became as contagious as the riots. H. Rapp Brown and his cohorts became the enemy within because they possessed a certain amount of intelligence for organization. Indiscriminate violence was fast becoming an insurrection created to destroy either the concept of private property or change the distribution of wealth among the classes.

In cities like Chicago and Washington D.C., the new left was no less committed to a similar project. Disrupt the establishment and you play havoc with its economic ability to generate the economics of violence and the violence of economics.

When the European settled across the face of America, he had brought with him the coner upon the native American Indian a concept of private property. In doing so, he fosl-land as a gift from the gods to be put to use

for the sake of the community. When America became a country, the pioneer began to survey and cordon off parts of the country for his own private use forbidding rights of passage across it. The Indian felt his whole structure of living to be threatened, and what followed were years of bloody fighting, almost total genocide and the eventual rounding up and corralling of the American Indian as we know him.

Today, in the same sense, the concept of private property has become an alien concept due to the lop-sided concentration of wealth in the hands of artificial entities while the have-nots have been cordoned off into ghetto areas without an exit or an entrance to political authority. If violence is ripe within these areas, it is because there is no other alternative for survival.

But those who justify violence or insurrection by pointing out that America was created amidst revolution and blooshed miss the whole point of her dilemma. America's revolution was brought about due to the economic inequities She suffered as a colonial state under the dominance of British rule. "No taxation without representation" was her particular grievance and her fundamental dream was that "all men were created equal and endowed by their creator with certain inalienable rights." This uto-

pian ideal of the leveling of class interests and attainment of political freedom unknown in western history at the time was soon to become subordinate to the Constitution of The United States. This document, shaped and molded by the Federalist leaders, such as Hamilton and Madison, was designed to place power in the hands of the property owning class, but it was generally believed, even by Madison himself, that friction between classes was caused by an uneven distribution of wealth. Daniel Webster, too, concurred that politics was based upon the foundation of economics, but went on to add that "the freest government, if it could exist, would not be long acceptable, if the tendency of the laws were to create a rapid accumulation of property in a few hands and to render the great mass of population dependent and penniless. In such a case, the popular power must break in upon the rights of property, or else the influence of property must limit and control the exercise of popular power."

The idea of property as a measurement of wealth has not changed greatly over the years, but that which represents property has multiplied from Gold, land and cattle in 1776 to today's currency, negotiable instruments, natural resources, credit and technology. In our present age, technology has created the greatest economic prize of all — information. This

BERLIN MADE INTO U.S. TEST RANGE

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (EVO) — The United States appears to be using the simmering Berlin situation as a test range to measure the mettle of the Soviet leadership. America is sure to meet with before the summer is out, observers here report.

While much of the mass media in the United States have chosen to report the new tension in the international city still under the control of the Americans, British, French and the Russians as being generated by the East Germans, the most recent first twist was from Washington.

With the brief exception of the Cuba crisis, Berlin, that is, the whole question of where the East-West border shall fall, is the only place where the great adversaries confront each other eyeball-to-eyeball.

So great are the dangers inherent in this confrontation that not a muscle was twitched in Berlin during the '62 missile crisis. In other circumstances it would be expected that the Cuba strategy would have forced the Russians to create a diversionary move in Berlin.

The latest Berlin/German round started when the Western powers plus Japan demanded that the Federal Republic of Germany be placed on the Preparatory Committee of the Economic Committee of the United Nations Economic and Social Council.

On the face of it, Bonn's presence seems a reasonable idea since the Germans certainly are in a position to be heavy contributors to the development plans which will be drawn by the committee.

But Germany is not a member of the United Nations (neither is East Germany, the Vietnams nor of course Communist China). And since ECOSOC is one of the prime organs of the UN — equal in status to the General Assembly — to place the Germans on the Preparatory Committee would be to give Bonn de facto membership.

The Germans have a permanent observer at the United Nations, but he has no voting rights.

The Russians, for their part, have offered a compromise by calling for the seating of the two Germany's on the committee, but the United States and its supporters refuse to accept that solution. This is based on the Western contention that German reunification is an essential political step that must be taken before progress can be achieved in other areas — namely disarmament.

The American thinking in the past 20 years has been that no settlement was made after World War II on the boundaries in Europe, and Berlin is symbolic of this, for here the four powers retain their control in one way or another.

The boundaries — including the concept of spheres of influence — need to be determined before so all parties know where they stand. Then, and only then, can talk of disarmament be meaningful, the Americans seem to state.

The Russian point to the existing boundaries and spheres of influence and say they are satisfied with them, including the idea of two Germanies which exists in fact anyway.

But what is to prevent the Russians from blitzing through parts of West Europe once the American leave? The Soviet has ordered such action in the past — have they changed so much today, the argument runs. So the Americans say in effect, "Russia, you prove

your sincerity about wanting disarmament (which the Soviet very much does want) by making a political concession in Germany."

But the Soviet has its interests to protect just as the West does, and indications found here at the UN are that Moscow is not in a position to make concessions now without risk to the ruling oligarchy.

Pressure is also being applied by the forthcoming presidential West German election scheduled for the first week in March. The Bundestag National Assembly elects the president.

It was suddenly decided to hold the election in Berlin rather than in territory of the FRG. The East Germans countered with banning all West German politicians and military from passing through the corridors into Berlin. Hence, the traffic tie ups reported this week.

Meanwhile, the United States and its allies in the OECD (the Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development which is the successor to the Marshall Plan) have given warning to the under developed nations that their support of the FRG's seating in the preparatory committee would be equalled by the monies the OECD members would invest in them. (The OECD includes the Common Market six, the U.S., Britain and Japan), and it was the OECD which formally nominated West Germany for the committee appointment.

And the Russians, in a statement made this week by Ambassador Y.A. Malik, have clearly stated that if the FRG is "unilaterally admitted", they will not "take part in the work."

At the same time, the French, who have been working to create a separate position from the United States in world affairs, have chosen to go along with the Americans at this time if only because the franc is still in danger without support from the German mark.

President Nixon, meanwhile, prepares for his journey to Europe which will probably result in his hosts being a bit nicer than they have to be while the street crowds will be less enthusiastic than Washington hoped. Except in Berlin: he is sure to be uproariously welcomed there.

It would seem that there is a simpler, more direct way for nations to effectively work out accommodations among themselves than all the maneuvering that has taken place in the past several weeks. John Foster Dulles' brinkmanship lives on.

BUDDHIST SHRINE ROTTING TO PIECES

JAKARTA, INDONESIA (EVO) — Funds are being sought to save the colossal Buddhist sanctuary in Java at Borobudur. The monument is the largest in the Southern Hemisphere.

The Dutch government, which owned the Indonesian islands before independence came, has contributed an initial \$15,000 toward the restoration and protection of the shrine which has a main stupa surrounded by 72 smaller, perforated stupas and four descending terraces with sculptured galleries containing 1,440 reliefs covering four miles of walls. (A stupa is a mound-like temple which is prayed around rather than in.)

The Borobudur stone is of a porous volcanic stone which is rotting a way because of the weather. Treatments have been developed which would chemically prevent further weathering. The Indonesian government estimates the cost of restoration at \$2 to \$3 million.

MEMPHIS, TENN. IS SINKING!

MEMPHIS, TENN. (EVO) — The United States Geological Survey has reported that Memphis and Houston, Texas are sinking, in some places as much as four feet.

The hydrologists said the threat to this city was due to increased pumping of water from the water-bearing sands that support the city.

The sinking phenomenon is not exclusive to Memphis, the scientists say. Some parts of Houston have already dropped four feet.

The hydrologists said that rather than gaping holes suddenly appearing, the surface of the land would simply drop lower, and lower, and lower, and lower . . .

HOT WATER DIRTIES RIVER

WASHINGTON, D. C. (EVO) — Many forms of aquatic animal and plant life are being threatened by the heated water discharged by power stations into rivers, lakes and coastal waters.

The threat is more potential than real right now, but it could become a serious hazard as more and more generating plants are built all over the world.

This was the conclusion of 200 scientists from six countries meeting for a "thermal workshop" held at the University of Maryland's Natural Resources Institute under the sponsorship of the International Biological Programme (IBP) and the U.S. National Academy of Sciences.

The discharge of heated water, or "thermal addition" as scientists call it, is not only of great scientific interest but also has considerable economic significance. Many of the areas affected by heated water are shellfish breeding grounds or nurseries where ocean fish spend much of their growing phase. There is the possibility that the heated water could be put to profitable use in warming up marine areas now too cold to support large fish populations.

But too much heat can be fatal to aquatic life. The scientists heard of one river in the north-eastern United States where temperature rises of up to 50° F have been recorded as a result of the discharges from various industries, and this has led to summer temperatures of 140° F — a level nearly 50° above the lethal threshold of most aquatic organisms. A further drawback of thermal addition is that it can cause fog by increasing the normal rate of water evaporation.

The scientists recommended that further workshops on the subject be held because of the great need for scientific data on the effects of thermal addition which they described as "a world problem".

CITY COLLEGE DIDDLYBOP SIT AROUND

NEW YORK CITY (LNS)—Black and Puerto Rican students took over the administration building at city college, located in the heart of Harlem, and held it for several hours Feb. 13. The move is looked upon primarily as a show of strength, to back up five relatively mild demands. Although no police were called, the Captain and another officer from the 26th precinct were on hand, observing all from an adjacent building, and keeping stray cop cars out of the way of potentially inflammatory incidents.

The demands call for the creation of a Black and Puerto Rican studies school, separate freshmen orientation, "a voice" in hiring and firing, admissions racially proportionate to city high school composition, and mandatory courses for all education majors in Black and Puerto Rican history and Spanish. Two radical white students were permitted to join the occupation forces.

When the President of the University, Buell Gallagher, approached the group saying "Hello, brothers," he was laughed away. His office released answers to the five demands—the sort of divide and conquer claims which radicals have come to expect in response to their militance—stating in effect that all five demands were being met already.

Black radicals see the occupation as only setting the stage for later tactical moves.

TIBETAN RITUAL

Ganga, as it's called in Laos, has for a long time been sold in the market place along side of tobacco and beetle-nut chewies. It comes in bunches (right off the farm) or in ready made joints tailored for the travelers' needs. It is considered by many to be first quality grass. Naturally the price is only a fraction of stateside, maybe fifteen cents for a fist full, the size of a package of celery. The color of the leaf is elf green, with a fresh, strong aroma of mint. Now that you've decided on your purchase, let's stop first at my place where you can clean it, and I can fill you in on how to use the bamboo water pipe. After that we can make it to The Opened Eye and groove on the scene. It appears upon imagination.

Now let's pretend we're at my place — you're cleaning the grass and I'm putting on tea with a chocolate ganga cake going in the oven. We've also got sounds and some mind trips on the wall. Why don't you examine the pipe while I describe it?

A length of bamboo, usually cut while still green, is measured in length, diameter and thickness of frame. Then a hole about a half inch across is drilled or bored at a sharp down angle toward the bottom closed portion of the tube, just up a few inches. The water that is put in later on will come up to this hole. Into this hole (as snugly as possible) will be inserted the half inch tube which will act as a stem — one end being submerged in the water to the tube bottom and the burning bowl fitted to the stem's other end. The bowl should be made out of a hard wood so as to last through many smokes. The tightness (water tightness, that is) of the fit where the stem is inserted into the bamboo tube can be improved, by using a gum, tar or any of those wonderful new products that seal well. By the way — an interesting thing to try using as the stem is a length of sugar cane. Merely run a rod thru the cane and use as the stem — it's moist and sweet, and your throat will say Thank You.

The size of the bowl is important in as much as only enough grass will fill it to meet the needs of one smoker; the pipe is not passed around. Here each smoker empties the "plate" himself. I have seen pipes that are and have been in constant use for over 25 years. This shows craftsmanship when the bamboo holds up that long. Pipes can run from 6 inches long with one inch diameters for easy toting, to three feet, by three inches, for home use.

The Chinese, Thais, Laotians, Malays, Javanese, and others have been smoking tobacco and ganga this way for many centuries. Since travelers only smoke green grass, not aged, and a fair quantity of it, the water pipe becomes a must to soak out the harshness. That is exhibited when many joints are smoked, and no moisture introduced.

Across the city and past the Buddhist Wats (temples), along the dustiest of roads in Asia, is the oasis of the weary traveler. The Opened Eye. Complete with restaurant (head food at low prices), bar for peace corps and college types, fly boys for Sam, and all others who come nightly to see "the monkeys" at home. The other section contains a stage for regular and impromptu live music scenes, and a back room where the practice of the pipe is employed. Let's move on in and take a place on the floor. The case for Cannabis Spirits is always in progress. Lined on the floor against the walls

are water pipes of all sizes with ornamentation that makes each distinctive. Let's try this model and I'll go thru the technique. Assume a comfortable position, either cross legs or sit on your heels. The idea is that the abdomen should not be restricted, so also no tight belt of naval elastic constrictions. First let's add a few drops of rose essence to the water, then we can fill the bowl with a mixture of chopped grass with a little finely chopped lime skin for "color." To warm up do a few practice deep in and out breaths to expand fully, and contract totally the lungs and diaphragm. Usually a second party (when around) lights the pipe of the smoker. Take the pipe with both hands and place the open contoured end firmly against the opened lips, after first completely emptying lungs of air. As I light the mix, draw with quick in and out breaths the column of air from the pipe before the smoke arrives, and then, long and deep, follow the smoke down as far as it will go. Pass the pipe, and close the door.

Tonight, a friend was building good Karma by making the pipes and imparting his tender vibrations to each and every bowl of greens. Charlie was guitarring the corner of the room down and out to where the mouse came in. All around, the carpet was in the air, as we floated through the beaded curtains and landed softly in the ceremonial pad. All the mystic paths are represented here. Everyone doing his own thing, loosely geared to other vibratory systems nearby. Candles, incense and beautiful people make this room one less, a wanderer's harmony.

In time one could read the writing on the wall, "THE MANAGEMENT AIMS TO PLEASE."

COPS CRACKDOWN ON COMMUNITY CONTRO

NEW YORK (LNS)—An armada of city police entered and seized the Tompkins Square Community Center at one a.m. Feb. 14. The city-owned building, in the heart of the Lower East Side, had been occupied by the community for over a year.

The people seized the building after it was discovered that a swimming pool, gymnasium, and other recreational facilities in it had been idle for over thirty years.

The police moved cautiously taking care to avoid arrests. They allowed the staff to remove files and other essential items before closing the building. The element of surprise, the overwhelming display of power, and the late hour virtually precluded resistance.

The raid was the latest and most drastic in a series of steps taken by the city in violation of written agreements made with the center. The city seems to be making an across-the-board crackdown on community control on the Lower East Side.

Resentment towards the city is running high.

STUDENT CONVICTED OF SETTING BOMB

ST. LOUIS (LNS)—Michael S. Siskind, 21, a Junior at Washington University, has been found guilty of attempting to destroy Government property. He was accused of placing a firebomb on the windowsill of the Washington University ROTC building.

Siskind is the first person ever convicted under the WW II Sabotage Act. He faces up to ten years in jail for his revolutionary act.

LNS ESPIONAGE CBS LABS ENGAGE IN SECRET SPY RESEARCH

The CBS research laboratories, located in New York City, are allegedly developing a super-spy camera for aerial reconnaissance work under a Defense Department contract. The camera works by sending down laser beams which are scanned for variations in intensity after they reflect up from the ground.

The cameras—CBS is reportedly constructing two prototypes for half-a-million each—can deliver far more resolution than either conventional optical systems or cathode tube scanners.

Furthermore, the images they receive can be instantaneously relayed to technicians on the ground, significantly cutting the length of time before aerial surveys can be put to strategic use.

CLASSROOMS NOW ON WHEELS

PHILADELPHIA, PA. (EVO) — Isolated rural schools in the United States have many students who spend up to 40 hours a month riding a bus to and from classes. Now some rural schools in here Pennsylvania and Colorado are experimenting with "audiobuses" to make use of the time usually lost on long bus trips.

Each school bus is a classroom on wheels since the installation of stereo sound systems, with earphones for each student. Each headset comes with its own volume and channel selector controls. Interested students may select from a number of tapes. They are consulted on their preferences and tested to check the effectiveness of the program.

The taped program in the Pennsylvania experiment are primarily concerned with fine arts and social studies. One channel usually carries a tape, "Great Moments in History", a series of dramatizations of important events in America's past. Other channels carry "Great Moments in Music" in which a famous symphony might be analyzed and performed. Well-known entertainers have recorded readings on the "Great Moments in Literature" tape. Each of the Pennsylvania buses carries five tape players, and each device carry a 15-minute educational programme.

The audiobus used in Colorado is more elaborate. Programs, both group and individualized, are classified under five topics — English, social studies, science, recreation, and fine art. Students may choose materials of these topics prepared for their own age level.

Some of the programs are educational travel guides to the area the bus passes through and include information about the economy, geological formations, plant life and climate. Other programmes include famous plays, readings, poems, music and Spanish-language instruction.

PUNISHING KNOUT

The hour is getting late. By the end of spring we should have the situation primed for a summer of such intense heat that all previous summers will be the glow of a panatella by comparison; by autumn the System will be on its knees. From the East Coast papers — except for the once-weekly Student Riot Wrapup in the Daily News — you'd suppose it was good Republican business as usual from coast to coast. But around the Bay in California the situation is fermenting. The American Federation of Teachers and the American Federation of Teaching Assistants, locals 1352 and 1928 respectively, some weeks ago joined with the Third-World Students at S.F. State to keep Hayakawa occupied; and last week the East Bay local of the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers, local 1-561, proclaimed solidarity with the S.F. State strikers.

At the Community Conference to Support the S. F. State Strike, held on 7 February at the Sun Reporter office in San Francisco, OC & A Secretary-Treasurer Jake Jacobs explained the provocations leading up to this action. The OC & A workers have been striking Standard Oil for some time, and their strike has been countered with all manner of illegal strike-breaking tactics on the part of the company, working with the assistance of the Richmond County Pig Department. An injunction passed in response to the OC & A strike limits the number of striking pickets to five at each gate of the Sandard Oil plant: this has left the strikers vulnerable to "the violent assaults by the company goons and strike-breakers who have escalated their armed attacks against our peaceful picketers," according to Jacobs, who was himself savagely beaten by Richmond County Pigs when he inquired at the

FEEL IT IN PUBLIC

When the FEEL IT environment now at the Crafts Museum was first shown in Stockholm, a middle-aged couple was so overcome by the force of the environment that they were discovered in the middle of it in an advanced state of love play. Sweden being Sweden, it is presumed they were allowed to continue. A teacher also ventured in with his class of problem children, none of whom had ever before succeeded in communicating with him or each other. In the midst of the environment a number of them actually broke down and began to talk to each other meaningfully for the first time — some of them even managed to talk about what psychiatrists might call their basic problems. Go to the FEEL IT show and find out what happens to you — you will discover an environment which will thrill, vex, or delight you. It may actually leave you physically out of breath. You are very unlikely to be indifferent to it. The Crafts Museum is next door to the Modern at 29 West 53rd Street.

But as far as the FEEL IT show has gone, it is still only a beginning when one realizes what is possible in this area. If anything, it is simplicity itself compared to what will be done in the near future in terms of theatrical, therapeutic, educational fun. No one should consider this a strange juxtaposition of words or concepts, for the fact is that theatre, therapy, learning, and pleasure are all beginning to come together, both in terms of the techniques used and the goals sought. It is a combination that will immeasurably enrich all four domains, though it may confuse pedants who imagine that categories from other centuries are necessarily unique or eternal, and it will certainly infuriate puritans who suppose that learning can only take place when accompanied by pain.

The fact of the matter is that we are only at the beginning of a process that may free man more completely than even the wildest utopians have imagined — no one knows how far we can go in this direction because no one has gone far enough to find out. It is not surprising that most of the techniques relating to this process are to be found in the field of light and environmental research, for it is precisely these factors which go a long way towards determining the present feel and style of society — by changing these factors society itself can be changed.

Thus the arts, which have always imagined themselves having the broadest possible effect on the entire population, are just about to wake up and find out they actually do have his effect. What were until yesterday merely grandiose pretensions may be tomorrow's every-day reality. The effects on the art world will be staggering, and



it is no accident that those artists most aware of what is about to happen are active in the field of Tech Art. Much of today's art world is still totally irrelevant to what is slowly growing within it and about to be born — it is as though a powerful and enormous lion were about to emerge from the womb of a pampered Persian cat.

Two of the artists most in contact with this transition are Takis and Billy Apple. The most important piece at the Takis show now at the Howard Wise gallery is undoubtedly his "Homage to Marcel Duchamp." This is a very down-to-earth piece, despite its in-groupy title, and consists simply of a bicycle wheel and a plunger. The usual constructivist put-on, one might imagine, but then one realizes that the plunger is meant to be put into tidal water, with the wheel resting beside it at the end of a lever. As the tide comes in and out, the wheel can be turned by the current generated by the moving plunger. And then one suddenly realizes that this is not primarily a work of art at all, though it may be seen as one, but a new way of providing a low level power source with applications for light

buoys and basic electricity in coastal areas. Takis considers this an invention as much as a work of art and has applied for patents to protect it.

This is typical of the fearless approach of the new artist, ready to think through again even the problems left over by the scientist and find new solutions to them. For those aware of what is happening today there are no boundaries left between areas of learning, only common territory. The rest of this show is very austere and remarkably unGreek. It is a myth of ponderous English and German schools that Greek art was ever terribly austere — even the sculpture of the archaic period was agleam with jewelry, armor, and color. This common misconception concerning the Greeks I have dealt with more fully in the current *New American Review* — for the time being it is perhaps fairer to describe the work of Takis as a highly intellectual reaction against the Greek love for color and movement.

There is certainly nothing austere about the work of Billy Apple. His material is the mainstay of our outdoor nighttime environment — neon,

but imaginative neon, brilliant neon, neon as we have never seen it. He is able to realize this because he is the first artist to mix his own colors in neon, which means he is not limited to the sickly reds and yellows on the signs of Nick's Bars across the nation. The colors he does mix are absolutely indescribable — some seem to sparkle and undulate, others are mixed in tubes within other tubes, still others are the result of glass interferences against the ion flow, a flow which actually becomes visible against a background of multi-colored fragments fighting to overcome each other. Billy Apple also bends his glass into exciting shapes and structures and makes use of helium, argon, and other gases. Description of his effects are probably beyond language, and the best thing to do is to wait until Billy sets up his new studio this spring, which he intends to open to the public.

These are only two instances. Everywhere among artists there is the feeling that something is afoot, in a way that there has not been since Paris before 1914, something that completely dwarfs the abstract expressionist movement a decade ago and the art world which grew up with and around it. Artists are beginning to take to their studios and tell the galleries to go to hell, or at least assigning them a more subservient role. This is partly because of the long period of relative affluence with foundation grants and high prices for art, partly because many artists have found they can deal just as well direct with the public as through a gallery. If galleries remain, it may be that they will change their function somewhat — in the past it has always been impoverished and unknown artists who have banded together to form co-ops. In the future it may be the best-known artists who do this, setting up a creators' exchange with a sales manager responsible to the artists under conditions allowing access to the young and the unknown. The details of this arrangement remain to be worked out in practice, but it is only one possibility for change in a time when even artists are crying out for it.

IN THE BEGINNING

AN INTERVIEW WITH GUNTER WEIL

by JAAKOV KOHN

Gunter Weil is one of the few that clustered around Tim Leary at Harvard and thus midwived the psychedelic age. The scope of their experience is the backdrop of the history of our time.

The following are fragments of a ruminating session.

EVO — Under what circumstances did you meet Tim Leary?

GW — As I said, the news about Tim and his experiments with consciousness expanding drugs was all over Harvard and the reason I went to see him was the rumor about the kind of experience it was. I remember going to his office and asking him if he would turn me on. He asked me a few questions, gave me a big smile and said SURE. My first session, which I had in Tim's house in Newton, followed shortly thereafter.

EVO — What did you take?

GW — Psilocybin. LSD didn't come into the picture as yet. It was the beginning for me and also very close to the beginning for Tim. During the previous summer he was turned on to sacred mushrooms in Mexico. (At the legendary swimming pool in Cuernavaca).

My baptism was followed by many more sessions and pretty soon more and more people be-



came involved. The Ginsbergs, the Huxleys.

EVO — When did LSD make its appearance?

GW — LSD came in the form of Michael Hollingshead, who by now is a legendary figure in the psychedelic grapevine. He came to Cambridge from England where, for a number of years, he had been involved in a variety of questionable activities. He appeared on our horizons in the form of a suicide note to Tim saying: "Dr. Leary, unless you come and talk to me immediately, I am going to kill myself." Naturally, Tim and a number of people went to see him. At that very point Michael opened Tim up to the LSD experience and blew his mind. Tim followed him for weeks as his Guru, his saint. Tim took a tremendous imprint from Michael. After all, that was the first REAL trip Tim and all of us had. LSD created a completely different dimension. We realized that with psilocybin we had been just messing around.

EVO — Did you use Mescaline too?

GW — Mescaline was in the picture but was never central. The mescaline experience did not compare LSD did.

We probably took enormous doses at the time because none of us knew how much to take. There weren't any qualifiable forms. This was typical. Besides Tim, Dick Alpert was very much there. Dick was a young, very energetic, highly visible psychologist at Harvard. Very much on his way to the top of the profession and a position of authority and control within the university itself. He was enamored of Tim very early in the game and got completely involved. It was very much the co-leadership of Tim and Dick that was central. We all got involved in what at the time was an at-

tempt on our part to turn LSD into a scientific, psychological experimental model. This is where we began the prison program in the course of which we turned many inmates on and had some fantastic results. All these experiences, the prison work, the turning on of the artists, the trips to New York for the society turn-ons and all the other different chapters that started to open up, blew our minds. Here we were a bunch of academicians (academics) and out of nowhere this drug was opening up all kinds of doors. Socially, politically, spiritually. It opened up a whole lot for all of us. Frankly, I was young and impressionable and the doors that opened up were in areas that were extremely tantalizing. We all exploited and used it and it was during that time that we built the cult thing in Harvard which got everybody very uptight. During the first year of our operation practically all the graduate students wanted to turn on and many did. They wanted to work with and for Tim. Understandably, this got the other faculty members of the Center very dragged with Tim and with us. A tremendous controversy started within the Center well before Harvard, let alone national visibility. The whole thing finally erupted when a number of faculty people got vindictive and called an open conference to which the press got admitted. This is where the lid started to blow off. The shit finally hit the fan at Harvard.

EVO — How were you affected by all this?

GW — Not as much as others. Being a graduate student I wasn't fired. I was called on the carpet and told in no uncertain terms that I was considered a liability. Tim and Dick got kicked out, Ralph Metzner got his degree and split and I was the only one left. I was debating with myself whether to leave or not but since I was just a year away from getting my union card, I wanted to stick it out. In any case, they made it very uncomfortable for me. In spite of everything I did during that year a lot of politicking. I sought friendly guidance and help from certain faculty members that were at least responsive and empathetic to the possibility that LSD was opening a new chapter in psychology.

EVO — Gunther, what happened in the Carribeans?

GW — After Tim got kicked out of Mexico and returned to Cambridge, we all sat down and tried to figure out our next step. We finally decided on one of the Carribean Islands. Frank Furgeson, Dave Levine and I were chosen to spearhead a guerilla force to the island of Dominica. We had been in contact with John Presmont the Keristan who had been writing us for months saying, "This is the scene for you — come down and make it here." We were pretty naive, didn't know too much and so finally ended up in Dominica. It was an unbelievable scene. Dominica was straight out of Joseph Conrad. Heavy temperature, dark skinned natives, voodoo and the last remnants of the British Empire. Presmont met us and while walking around the capital with him, we were stopped suddenly by a cop who handed John a summons. It turned out to be his deportation order. The funny thing about it was the fact that he was a national hero of sorts because the year before he rescued a number of people trapped by a fire. He was decorated for this but the government was afraid of him. They thought he was a communist. John was a hero and a villain at the same time. On top of everything he had been consorting with the opposition that had socialist leanings. They were very paranoid because that island was the end of the road for the British Empire.

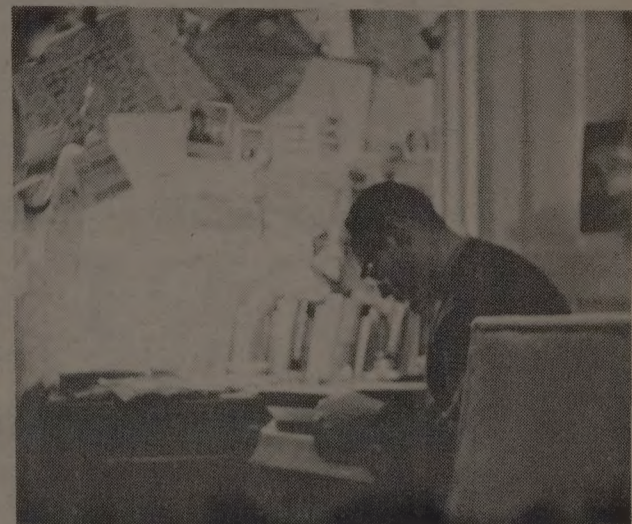
Here we got wrapped up in a political scene which was the last thing we wanted. All we came for was to find a groovy place to set up a scene. We went there to set up UTOPIA. That was our goal yet here we got all embroiled in John's political fiasco. Soon thereafter Tim with about 20 women and children and a Landrover arrived. The scene was very uptight and shortly, as was to be expected, we were deported. I remember an extraordinary scene in the colonial office with the senior colonial officer. That stuffy cat was quoting to us Hoffman's German article on his first LSD experience (where he was floating above his body) and telling us "We can't have any of THAT"

To which Tim, in his typical fluency retorted "We'll bring Huxley and Ginsberg down, and turn

this island into a spiritual center. We'll treat alcoholics and addicts and Dominica will be known as the greatest rehabilitation center in the world. We shall make this island famous." Tim was doing his number but the Englishman wouldn't have any of it. We were deported under the most paranoid conditions. We had to stash the last of the LSD in one of the children's toys and to add insult to injury, we were all barred from Dominica for life.

EVO — Where did you go from there?

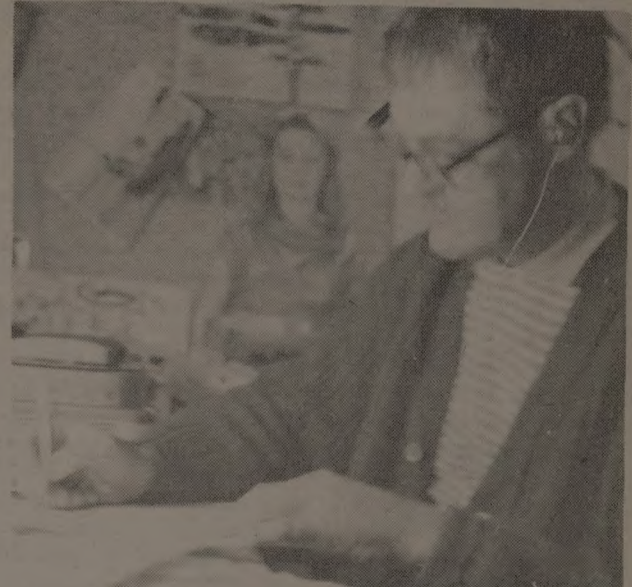
GW — Dick Alpert was already in Antigua trying to establish a beachhead. He befriended a hotel owner and so we set ourselves up in a beautiful place called "A Bucket of Blood." It was an abandoned WW II Navy nightclub.



We were there for just a few weeks when we again got involved in political machinations that have characterized all of Tim's life. Interpol, came into it too because the word was out all over the Carribean that we were a bunch of renegade communist drug takers. There was unbelievable paranoia wherever we went.

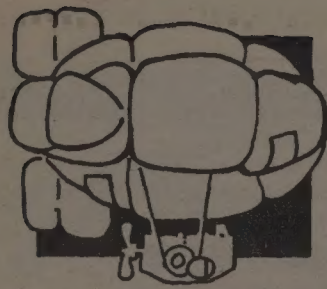


In Antigua we made contact with a number of young doctors that were fighting the medical establishment. A mainstay of that establishment was a Hungarian refugee with a dubious past who was the island's chief psychiatrist. He was very suspicious of us, probably because of his own suspicious past. He appeared one day on the island



and nobody knows how and from where he ever got there. This cat teamed up with another physician, a lobotomist known throughout the islands. He was just a doctor who read a number of books on lobotomy and started practicing at large. This cat was creating mindless creatures wherever he went and for that he was decorated by Trinidad. For having performed a great service. That guy would lobotomize you at the slightest whim. A cold,

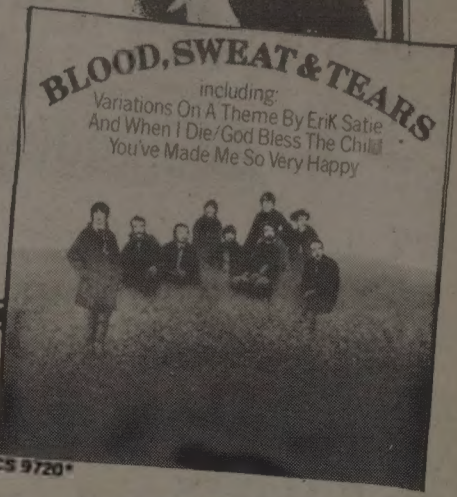

We earned the support of the community — the minority groups in particular — by our actions in solidarity with people getting a dirty deal from the big corporations and the establishment. But this authority is being dissipated by the smug complacency and blind narrowmindedness of the bulk of the labor movement . . . I pledge myself to exert every effort to rally the material and concrete support of my membership and labor generally behind the struggle of striking Third-World students and teachers in return for their help on our picket lines. We are going to receive the old spirit of solidarity and identification with progressive social causes that characterized the historic movement of organized workers for justice and equality."

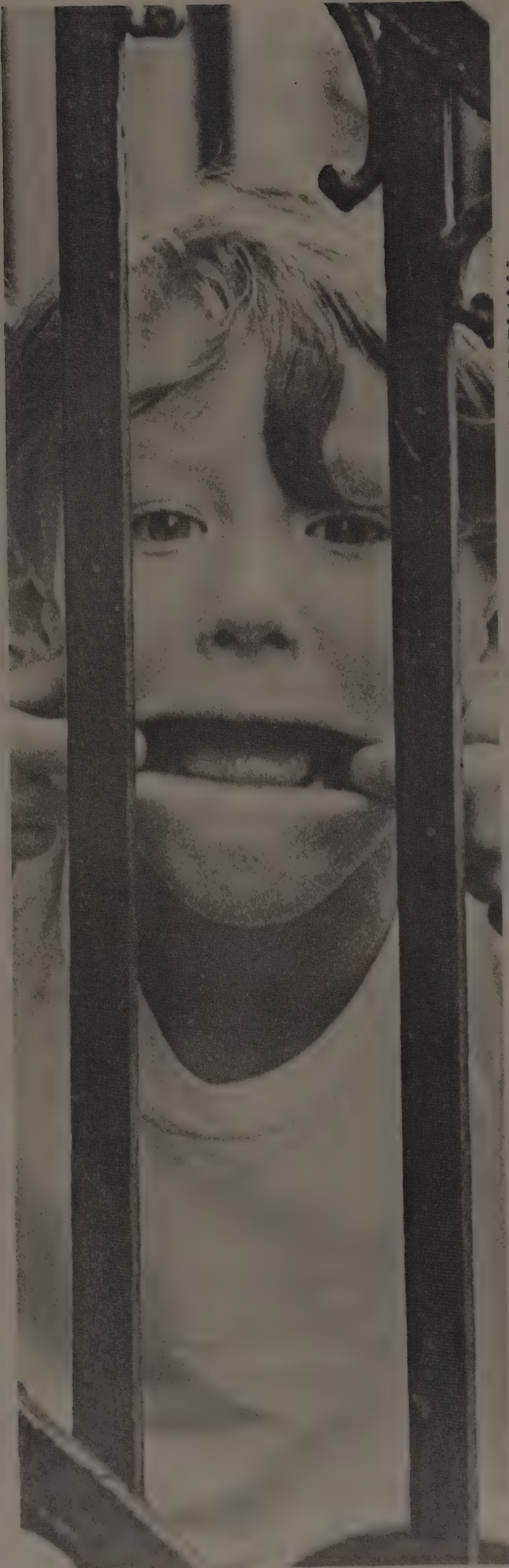

EMANATIONS

In this column, questions will be answered relating to matters of occultism, spiritualism, magic, witchcrafts, and related subjects. Questions which, for reason of length or lack of general interest, cannot be answered in the column, will receive a personal answer if the questioner will enclose a stamped self-addressed envelope. Q. I am extremely interested in occultism and would like to make it my major study, but I am very disturbed than no one in this field has taken an active part in such current matters of importance as Civil Rights, resisting the Draft, and all that. Can you comment on this? .R.

Dear J.R. — I don't believe there is an occult "party line" on these things, simply because most students of such things feel that their major interests are not of this world and that their main business is to live a life of rectitude and spiritual rightness without becoming entangled in matters of the present social order. Buddha taught that the only way to correct the evils of the world was to become indifferent to them. The Christian faith has always had — at least at its heart — a sense, however, that a large part of spirituality lay in improving this world. The Christian churches have a woeful reputation, but early Christianity was greatly concerned with the social ills of the day.

The New England Transcendentalists — precursors of modern occult studies — were mostly deeply aware of social injustice. It was Thoreau's booklet on Civil Disobedience which sparked Gandhi's movement for free India, and there is, of course, the famous story about the time when the famous abolitionist had gone to jail for his refusal to obey one of the laws of the day. A friend, visiting him, asked "What are you doing in jail, Mr. Thoreau?" He immediately countered "What are you doing out of jail, when the laws of our country are in such a state?"

I suspect that both viewpoints have some force behind them. I do not believe that anyone can be spiritually at ease if too much compromise is made with a society which allows no room for growth of the human spirit; the first step in occultism is to assess one's own principles and the strength of one's own commitment to them. It goes without saying that no one who is personally involved in perpetuating a social injustice is on the Path at all. "Right Means of Livelihood" is one of the Buddha's precepts for following the Noble Eightfold Path, and every spiritual search has some such precept. I could not imagine a slum landlord, or a drill sergeant, speaking of a spiritual life without an appalling degree of hypocrisy. But if you personally are not perpetrating the injustice, I think every individual must decide for himself to what degree he wishes to get out and fight for reform of society. It may be some people's karma, or destiny, to walk the picket lines, write pamphlets, and do everything else required. Others may feel that any involvement with a sick society is simply a meaningless attempt to avoid one's personal concerns by physical activity, and that one can best reform society by reforming one's own heart and soul. I have always had a sneaking sympathy for Martha — but Christ preferred Mary.

Widening The Generation Gap

This is a lesson in how to screw up relations between the old and the young parent and child. I've just returned from a trip to Miami, Florida, an area only now awakening to the phenomenon of drug use by young people. In their concern and fright over potential dangers to students, school and law enforcement officials, some physicians, civic leaders and the Miami Herald-Miami News have joined together in a campaign against drug use which borders on hysteria.

I watched a TV program in amazement as a physician, who "sees a narcotic pusher behind every palm tree", according to one Miami Herald reporter, described what he believed to be the dangers of marijuana use. First he said that marijuana damages chromosomes, a statement which would be debatable even if it referred to LSD. No source even semi-reliable claims marijuana use damages chromosomes. Then he described how THC can cause a trip similar to LSD. He neglected to explain that massive quantities of marijuana leaf would be required to achieve a similar result.

The physician continued with descriptions of how LSD and heroin are added to marijuana joints in order to "hook" the user.

Now these arguments are frightening indeed to the concerned parent but laughed at by their children. That's the problem: Lie to a kid about marijuana and he won't believe what you say about speed or heroin. Why should he?

School officials in Broward County, just north of Miami, recently began unauthorized searches of school lockers and desks. Dade County (Miami) school officials have asked permission to deputize the school system's security personnel to give them police powers off the school grounds so they can prowl school parking lots and nearby businesses.

At a meeting sponsored by the Dade County School Board, Florida State Attorney, Richard Gerstein, said narcotics was the single greatest crime problem. Understand now that South Florida has for many years been a stronghold of organized crime and that civic corruption and blatant racism are accepted modes of life there. Restrictive covenants, though illegal, are still being used in sections of Miami which prohibit home owners from selling to those who have "one-fourth or more Hebrew blood."

Gerstein's assistant, Al Sepe, urged the audience to "search rooms, shoes and drawers" of their children to gather "proof" of drug usage. He said a well-brought-up child would understand.

Drug abuse is a public health problem with potentially serious consequences to individuals. We don't know all the right answers, but we do know some wrong ones: One is the punitive approach to health problems. A second is lying about the effects of drugs. A third is fostering distrust between parent and child, "authorities" and lay people.

The best approach to any social problem must be education. And if the chief danger from a drug is its illegality, we must tell that, also, to potential users.

Anyhow, thinking about it later, on the plane ride, it seemed like such a great idea, and still does. Remember: erotica, not porn. If anybody out there has some erotica they'd like to show, call EVO, 228-8640, and leave some information. And no I really don't want obscene phone calls and people jerking off on the other end of the phone and all the other little NY tasties, folks, so please, don't waste the dime . . .

As of right now, I am not sure where or when, but hopefully it will be multi-floor, allowing simultaneous entertainments: some art work, films, one room with projected slides for dancing, etc. . . .

PEACE is a new musical, playing at the Astor Place Theatre on Lafayette Street, and it is very very good. Al Carmines and the Judson Poets Theatre are self-indulgent and very aware of whose talent is just what, so that dancers (Arlene Rothlein) dance and singers sing (oh, everybody, but Julie Kurnitz as Liza and George McGrath as Rastus in particular). The story is supposed to be taken from Aristophanes; sure sure sure as we used to say in 6th grade. Trygaeus, a mortal—an Athenian—has decided to go to hebbin an' talk wid de Lawd, and ask him, why there is so much suffering on Earth . . . Where is Peace?

This and other such sentiments are sung aloud as plot material by Liza and Rastus, the loyal darkies on this Athenian plantation—guess what country 'Athenia' stands for. Anyhow, there are dem darkies, and dere is Trygaeus, and he gets up to Hebbin to find—not God, or indeed any of the gods; just a fagged Herme, playing the Methenger, dahling . . .

And so the play goes; although it's a happy musical so no harm in explaining that Peace is found for th time-space quotient of the play at any rate.

The techniques are a marvelous amalgam of what is going on in theatre now. The lights are out; there is one severe blue-lit backdrop, and out come two actors, dressed strangely and seeming to wear platform shoes as the Greek actors did: they are in shadow, silhouetted against the blue . . . they move affectedly, strangely. The lights go on, they are darkies being played by very obviously blue-eyed whites. They sing about their master who is feeding shit-cakes to this creature off-stage. They talk about bosses feeding shit-cakes to everyone. Tee-hee they even draw the analogy for you. Later in the play, there is a fake-fuck scene taken straight from moments of *Conquest of the Universe*, and a song that extolls Pussy, a slight nod to *Hair*.

Still, the whole is by far greater than the parts Al Carmines and musicals are made for each other, even if every number—and I mean every number—is conceived as the finale, with endless choruses and whole-cast participation and crashing chords and so on. By the end of the play, I was no longer sure if it was the end of the play—each song seemed to have its very own resolution *in toto*, and I saw no reason for the last song to be considered any more of a summary.

The only god left to watch over Earth is War—and I mention this not to further reveal the plot, but because War, played by David Pursley is such a splendid character, looking like a cross between Dracula and, strangely enough, Al Carmines. War's weapon against the world is so brilliant I won't spoil the fun by telling what it is . . .

Peace is very funny, not trying to solve great theatre problems or the world's it is content with revealing several causes for man's discontent—such as his refusal to share Abundance, and a bedrock damaging egotism. It is a very pleasant surprise to actually go to a musical today, not to mention any off-Broadway indigenous show, and like it. I was very pleasantly surprised. Among those responsible for the play are, of course, Al Carmines and Larry Kornfeld, composer and director of Judson Poets; also Nancy Christoferson whose costumes are really marvelous.

Where Eagles Dare . . . is for the brave, the daring, the cool-headed and stonghearted. In a word, it is for Richard Burton, as Major John Smith, to lead 2 others up to this castle, see, which is in an im-preg-na-ble position in the Alps (they speak big words slowly so you can get the full flavor. Impregnable means it would take an eagle just to not get nosebleeds while climbing up there.) Anyway, Richard leads his small party into the Castle of the Eagles, where it just so happens the whole Gestapo and the Wehrmacht are in residence. No odds, folks: Richard has Clint Eastwood and Mary Ure with him; that makes this Super-Dick, Super-Cowboy and Super-Chick . . . so there we are, all the Heroes of the Western World vs. the usual sloppy-copy Bad Guys, for one of the most incredible spy stories of all time. If this movie plays at drive-ins, it may be one of the few which will get a larger percentage of the audience than the car's back seat floor.

Where Eagles Dare lasts 2½ hours and not one minute of it is boring. A more incredible feat that any performed in the movie, by the way, in these days of hour-long eyesores. The plot turns and twists back on itself like a psychedelic pretzel, but somehow always manages to please. It is very difficult to decide just what to say about the flick, because all the pleasure is in sitting there, hissing the bad guys and cheering the good guys and mouthing the lines along with everyone—because you know, you really do, just what Richard is gonna say to Mary Ure when they're alone in the woodshed in sub-zero weather; and you know, you just know, that Clint Eastwood is a good guy, not to mention the only American on the mission, even though there are a few tense moments there.

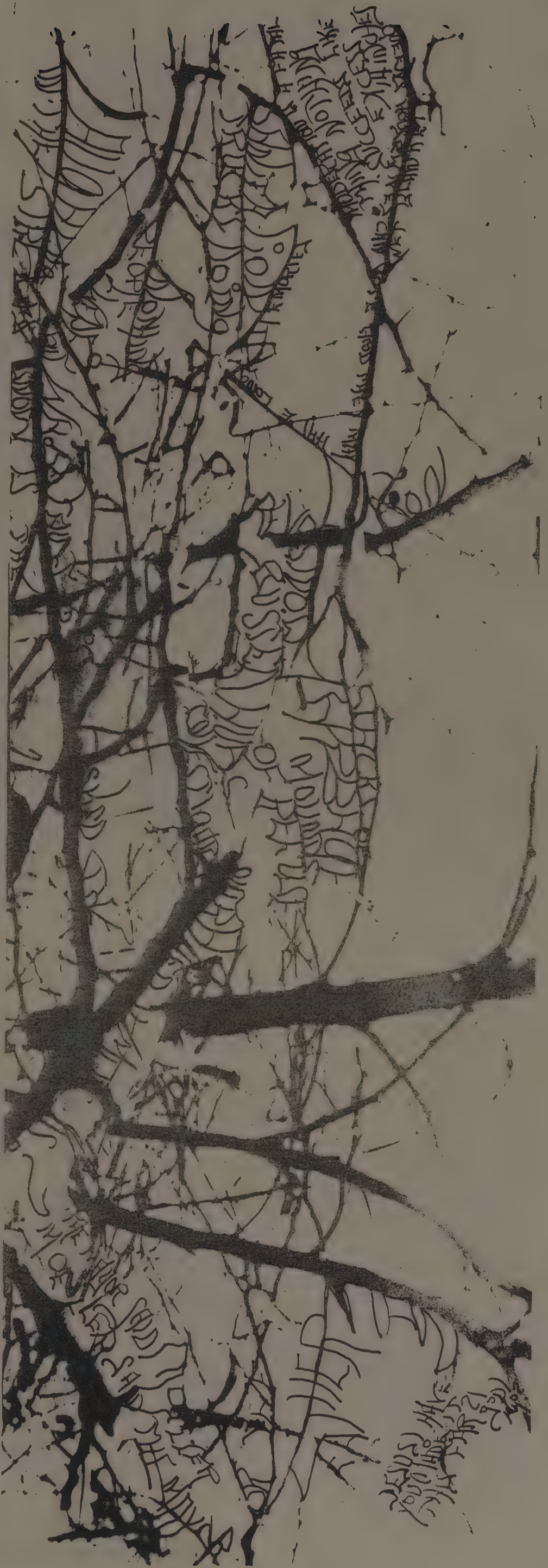

James T. Carey, *THE COLLEGE DRUG SCENE*, Spectrum Books paperback (Fountain-Well, 1968, \$2.45)

Behind a fake-psychedelic cover is a piece of sociological research conducted at Berkeley which is anything but fake. Carey might have been expected to produce something on the order of the notorious Louria and Blomquist rubbish, since after all he is a respected professor in the Criminology Department at the University of California; but he has instead put on his other hats as a sociologist and a researcher at the lamented Height-Ashbury Free Clinic, and produced a realistic picture of the Berkeley scene. It is probably just as well that a book like this has finally come from someone obviously respected in the Establishment. Coming from an admitted head, it would be dismissed as mere special pleading; coming from a narcotics officer, it would certainly consist of moral strictures. Carey has instead used, not the sterile and inaccurate IBM-oriented methods of survey research, but interviews and participant observation techniques far better calculated to get at the truth. For after all, the task of a sociologist trying to get people to tell about activities which could get them flung into jail is difficult, and the tendency is always to encounter put-ons or concealment. Carey's method has enabled him to avoid both, and thus to get a more reliable account of the scene.

And it is an accurate enough account, as anyone from Berkeley can confirm. One might question Carey's terminology here and there, in particular his sharp distinction between "recreational users" and heads, and his omitting to distinguish between the ecstatic followers of Huxley and Leary and the more cynical heads for whom acid is just another drunk — though that distinction was and is more common outside the Bay Area than in it, to be sure. Some will surely question Carey's decision to call the head subculture neither "hippies" nor the hip community nor even the New Community, but "the Colony." Though he does not spell out why, apparently his reason is that this neutral term lacks the adverse newspaper connotations of "hippies" and will thus not offend the Establishment. Carey has to sound objective more than sympathetic, otherwise his task of demolishing prejudices of the Anslinger persuasion might sound like just one more apologia for grass or acid.

Accordingly, few hip readers will find much new here, but after all the book is aimed not at them but at their parents, at social science people (hence the emphasis on sociologically impeccable terminology, and the occasional difficult technical language in the first few chapters), at social workers, police, judges, college administrative personnel, ministers and other Establishment people who have "recreational users" caught in the act. If a book aimed at these groups manages without sounding like a piece of special pleading, the sociologists use of the term "recreational users" is a first-class addition, and "LSD destroys minds and chromosomes" type, it will have served its purpose.

As the more easily point-with-pride aspects are shown. Among "recreational users" are many who have in no sense abandoned either jobs or family or other responsibilities; among acid-heads, on the other hand, though the orientation is (or at least was then) more religious than irresponsibly hedonistic, there were and are many fools and immature people, just as there are within the "Great Society", but then there are also people trying to live a philosophy whose tenets are literally those of Christ, an ideal forgotten in the "Great Society:" and who is going to say that they are automatically fools

BRIDE OF DARKNESS, by Margery Lawrence. Ace Books, 1969; first published in Great Britain.

THE WOMAN WHO COULD NOT DIE, by Caroline Busey Bauman. (Fountain-Well, 1968, \$2.45)

Among paperback book publishers, the recent fad for "Gothic" novels seems to be subsiding — which is probably a good thing, except for the die-hard mostly-female addicts of the genre. It gets tedious to wade through rack after rack of paperbacks, all without exception bearing lurid covers displaying an ancient house, tower or castle, with one lighted window; a dead tree in the foreground; a dishevelled female, hair awry, dress torn, and an attitude of excruciating terror on her face; and a storm coming up in the background. Which proves, as Buck Coulson put it, that Gothic heroines haven't sense enough to come in out of the rain. We knew it all along.

However, the new wave of rampant occultism, causing even such consumer-training magazines as *GLAMOUR* and the *LADIES HOME JOURNAL* to feature astrological diets and "your individual beauty horoscope" has caused the paperback publishers to start flooding the stands with something called "Black Magic novels" which seem to be a combination of Gothics, mysteries, and old-fashioned horror stories. They are either very good, or absolutely ghastly; there seldom seems to be a mediocre one. One either stays up all night to finish them, or tosses the book unfinished into a wastebasket, in a rage at having spent the sixty or seventy-five cents.

The two above listed are no excep-

THE WOMAN WHO COULD NOT DIE falls into the very, very good category. Faintly reminiscent of Richard Matheson's unforgettable novel of psychism, *A STIR OF ECHOES*, or of some of Robert Nathan's poignant fantasies, it is the story of a young woman, married to an artist, who moves into a house of the perhaps predictable "haunted" variety. The house is sinister to her; the ghost of a malevolent cat, invisible and malicious children who surround and torment her, and an overwhelming sense of being under attack. On the other hand, her husband is instantly obsessed with the house, locks her out of his studio, and declares that he is being inspired to paint a masterpiece — and slowly the heroine realizes that the studio is haunted by the ghost of a dead woman, whose price for inspiring her husband is — her

For once, the writer appears to know something about occultism, and her story is a masterpiece of Gothic horror. I like this sort of book — I do, but I don't like to see it written as a piffle written and sold as occult novels.

And then there is *BRIDE OF DARKNESS*.

Well, you can't win'em all.

There is a little dedication; "To Mr. X, who allowed me to use his own strange life story as the basis for this novel."

The narrator of this story is a man (although the writer puts phrases in his mouth which make him, in the words of Dion Fortune, "such a man as never wore trousers; on whom, in fact, trousers would be superfluous.") He marries a girl named Gilda Pirelli and it quickly becomes apparent (to everyone except the narrator, who must have holes in his head) that there is Something Wrong with the girl. For instance, she refuses to wear a cross and goes into hysterics at the sight of one. She has a little habit of giving mani-

Before his last set at the Fillmore East Saturday night, the aging rocker was nonchalantly munching a pastrami sandwich while being given head by a kneeling foxy white groupie historian. Suddenly an intruder, none other than Ellen Sander—the current ace chronicler of the pop world's sexual folkways, burst into the dressing room. Without missing a bite or disturbing his worshipper's motion, the suave Berry politely asked Miss Sander for some mustard.

His riff as the showcaser of "modern sounds for youth" causes the spine to quiver as his plans for presenting jazz reveal his taste in this area to be nothing more than a soggy blast from the past crossed with the delusion that the exponents of the most plastic, nehru jacketed pop jazz are where the music is at.

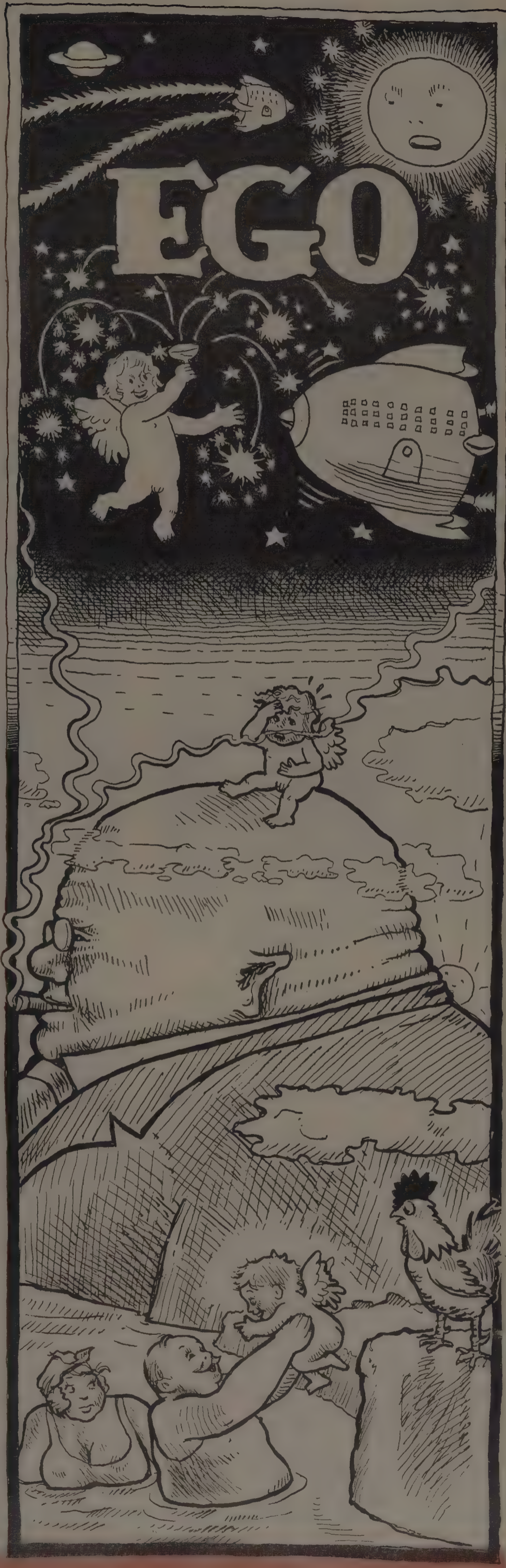

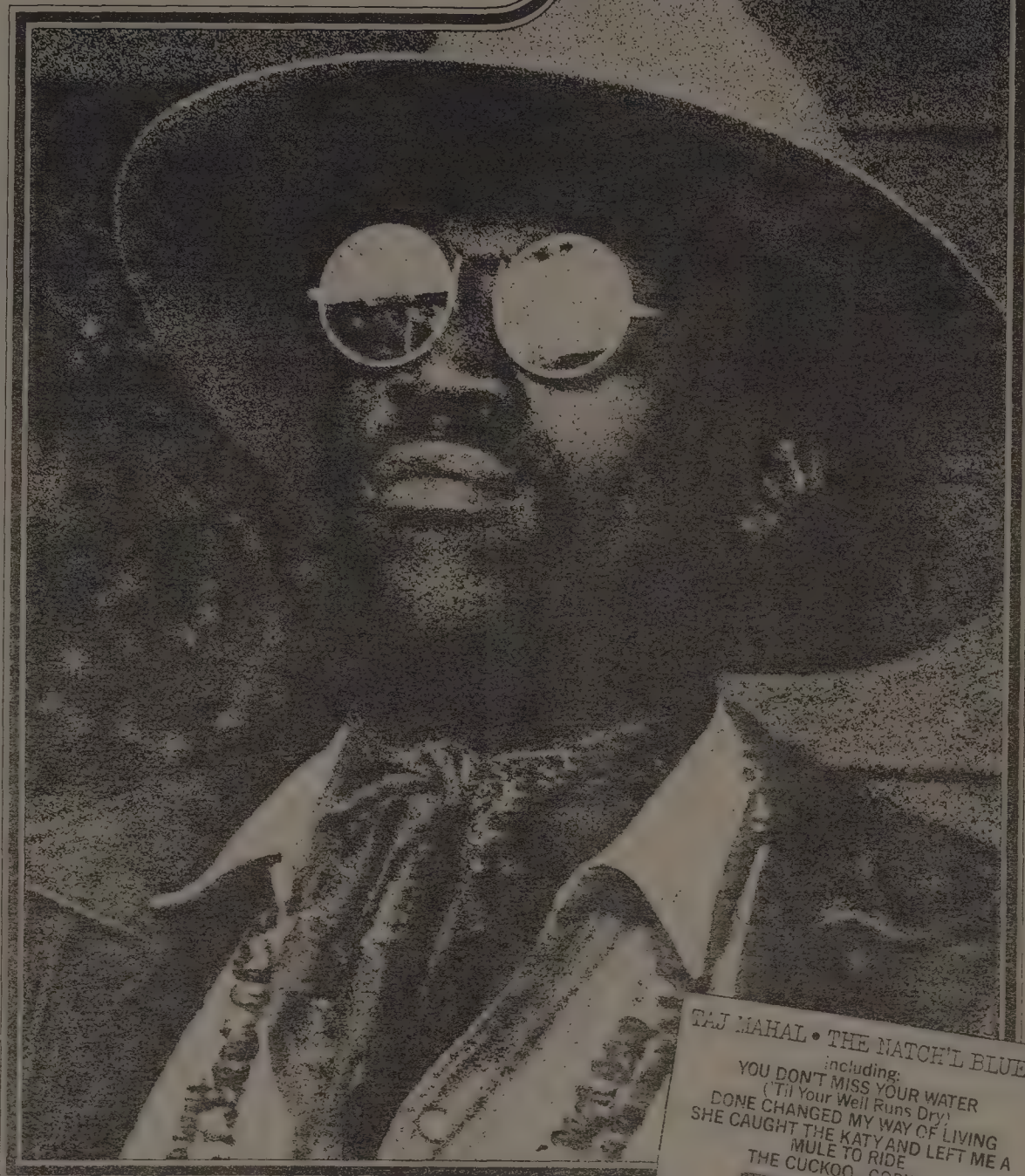

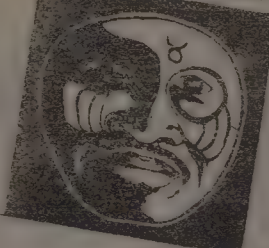

anything went as long as the mood struck him. Now imagine us all turned on and flipped out, besides being renegade psychologists, encountering this maniacal lobotomist. At this point Frank Furguson really flipped out. This was the first of the real psychotic flipouts on LSD that I have seen. We tried to shelter him but one day he took off and went to the Hungarian psychiatrist and his lobotomist friend. They put him immediately away in a stockade mental hospital, the place was right out of our worst hallucinations about primitive mental hospitals. These were wood and tar paper shacks surrounded by barbed wire fences in middle of the jungle. They stuck Frank in with an 80 year old insane german whose beard reached the floor and who constantly mumbled and drooled. Even though Frank knew, in spite of his psychosis, what was going on, he played his heavy number. We finally got him out of there and shipped him back to the States. Shortly thereafter they threw us out of Antigua too, and we finally ended up in Millbrook.

EVO — Did you stay in Millbrook?

GW — No, but I stayed for a while helping with the cleanup. I remember the first time we came to the big house. It was all shuttered and boarded and completely run down. I remember the smell of must and dirt when we walked in the first time, but it was a fantastic building and we all loved it at first sight. After I got my degree I went to teach at Brandeis but spent practically every weekend in Millbrook. At the end of that year I dropped out myself. I took my family, loaded the station wagon and moved to Millbrook. That was the summer of '64. In time we realized that the scene wasn't for us but I felt that I had to go through that number. Renunciation and all. Millbrook to me was just another flipped out, domestic kind of scene with all the hangups and all the same boring problems. Dirty hallways, the dog shitting all over the place, kids screaming and everybody's ego confronting everybody else's ego. The only difference was that everybody was high all the time and trying to be loving and beautiful and trying to be the way they felt they should be. Basically nobody was really free. It was a scene that I wasn't really after. I was looking for an ashram type of place that opened up other areas. Millbrook didn't offer the answer. At the end of that summer the nucleus started to fall apart. Dick Alpert went his way, I went mine. Ralph was the only one of us who stayed with Tim. Ralph's devotion and dedication to Tim was tremendous.

EVO — Do you still maintain contact with Tim?

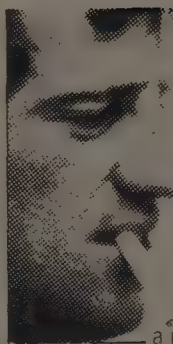
GW — Yes. We are inextricably bound together on some level of karma. All of us. I see or talk to all of those guys at least once or twice a year, usually under some interesting circumstance. It's a loose but sturdy network that binds us together.

EVO — Gunther, are you still taking LSD?

GW — No I don't. I haven't for a number of years.

modern translation of electricity has drastically changed the theory of private property to a large extent. As our system becomes more and more technological, information is transformed from a mater of facts to the one and only product necessary for economic consideration. The ability of the computer to store, disseminate and transfer this product into usable consumer items at the speed of light constantly outdates other products on the market and creates new industry. This centralization of power resides only in those groups who have acquired the enormous capital to produce and maintain such a system — The Federal Government and Super Corporate structures. This eliminated the necessity of all middle-man groups from the sphere of producers of property to a one dimensional line of consumers. This elimination then shifts ownership of property from individual to corporate possession. In the make up of corporate possession, I am including institutional groups such as pension funds, bank trust departments and mutual trust funds which on the main have acted as trustees for middle class economic power.

It is rather ironic that the founders of our country regarded Corporations as artificial entities without a soul and yet felt a political system based upon economic considerations as essential. This shift of the possession of private property has produced, in America, a new class of citizen referred to as the managerial class or directorate. Essentially what has evolved is a group which controls itself by owning a large percentage of stock in its own corporation or has become totally alienated from its source of capital, for example the middle class, and therefore moves freely without hinderance from other stockholders.

"They make decisions of national importance such as allocation of resources, direction and nature of investment and development of new products. The directorate is often an agency of administration for government; staggering amounts of the public administration are farmed out to private organizations.

This is particularly noticeable in the manner in which the Pentagon and NASA use private firms in procurement of large weapons systems and space systems. The directorate is often the 'chosen instrument' for effecting National Policy, as in airlines industry operating under government franchises, or in communications where the mass media, with or without franchises, are instruments of a pervasive system of propaganda. The directorate, as a corporation, is tax protected, and as an organized group influence the major decisions within the political arena over the popular will. By their monopolization of property, they therefore undo what is known as 'the self-interest of men leveling against each other and controlling each other through competition.'

III

It is this primary understanding of self-interest within the confines of our own history which seems to cause the most confusion and frustration among the new left. This group is mainly expatriots from the white middle-class, and unlike the American Indian and Black Man, have been separated from their society, instead of corralled, by years of political sterilization. Leaving their material surroundings behind, both unshaven and unshorn, they eventually sought to change the political, moral and economic climates of this country and meet fully the ideals of the Declaration of Independence. They are a class in society unto themselves, tied to the tactics of disruption as an outside force. Having no economic power to contribute to a political system which is basically run by and upon regional-economic self-interest in the areas of both domestic and international affairs, the new left has done little to change the course of events with any great degree. Their power does not come from their ability to disrupt, but rather from the inability of this same political system which it seeks to disrupt. This same political system that applies regional-economic solutions to problems that exist over the whole face of the nation and, in failing to solve anything, leave huge vacuums in the system itself.

IV

The failure of America's economic climate to create a viable political system is not a modern occurrence. It was pointedly brought to light in the war between the states in 1861. Before those years, North and South had grown further apart from political compromise simply because their economic interests had changed. The North had grown into an Industrial complex consisting of wealthy manufac-

turing entrepreneurs and a paid laboring class, while the South's landed estates had blossomed into huge plantations employing slave labor to produce an abundance of crops with cotton as the main stay. At this point in time, the concept of private property was changing to include industrial wealth which the South refused to accept as legitimate but for all practical purposes had felt its power in the political arena. Another factor was that population centered mainly in the northern cities, while in the South it remained stable. This gave the North more economic viability and greater justification for political leadership. Also, the expansion of the railroads into territories West of the Mississippi enabled the Industrial Empire of the North to consolidate political power in these areas and force those territories into the Union as non-slavery states. This pressured the South into recognizing her-

self and her economic capabilities a dramatic and final struggle for survival with slavery as the most important issue.

What has occurred since the end of the Civil War and until recent times is an economic and political process that changed little the concept of regional-economic self-interests. The defeat of her armies and the destruction of her estates so enraged the Southern political and economic factions that they aligned themselves with the ideals of Jacksonian agrarian democracy even after the war, fought hard against Northern civil and Industrial progress and by doing so fostered a one party system within its own borders. Although National Democratic party ideals have changed greatly through the years, it has, until recently, been able to hold the South's political affiliation through economic compromises. As for the one party system down South, it has

enabled the Southern hierarchy to create a seniority in the House and Senate thereby allowing it to capture choice positions upon powerful committees that prepare laws or change them for the majority of the population. These powerful chairmanships give the Southern Democrats or any minority of the political population with a one party system within its own state, the ability to keep laws in committee that it does not like till it dies of old age or compromises the very essence of those laws till it flakes away at the slightest implementation or otherwise diverts funds, which on the whole have come mostly from urban areas, to its own territories at a lop-sided ratio of give and take. The allocation of taxes through the senate and the house have, in fact, become so outlandish that it defies any sort of logical understanding. If indeed, the cry in 1776 was "no taxation without representation", it has changed in 1969 to no taxation without proper allocation. What the new left and other frus-

trated citizens see as the nation's improper evaluation of priorities is in actuality an imbalance of economic power in the hands of minority interests whose aim has always been one of self-interest and never solutions to national problems.

Another factor for frustration and misunderstanding is the idea of State's rights. In years gone by, the federal government has left certain responsibilities and the ability to meet them in the hands of the states. One illustration is the welfare laws. These laws vary from state to state with the result that those who seek a decent welfare wage to live upon must seek it in the cities up North whose welfare requirements are easier to meet and whose pensions are much higher. This influx of unskilled laborers mainly from the South who have been put out of work by advancing technology has created great havoc among the metropolitan areas of big cities. These cities are also jeopardized by what I stated previously to be an improper allocation of tax monies to meet the problems of welfare. The South, in this case, has refused to meet the responsibility for its own citizens by hiding

behind what has become in recent years a flaw in the Constitution — the idea of state's rights. It is merely one more economic ploy to disable the political viability of major populated areas from being fully represented in the legislative branch of government. This particular ploy can even be seen in state government representation.

The South's ability to keep her labor costs down is also an inducement to large corporations and the federal government to set up shop within the states. This bit of temptation forces federal leaders and directors of big corporations to accept all the injustices that occur within the states' borders and all the misallocation of funds that occurs within Congress itself.

Violence and disruption are tactics which in other periods of time and in other locations have succeeded quite readily. It is quite understandable that the new left should also apply these tactics to present conditions. It must be understood that these prior locations were agrarian cultures and therefore, after the revolution, the populace went back to the plowing and reaping of the nation's particular source of wealth without the usual disruption that would occur in a highly technical and complex society such as the United States. The new left's alignment, to say the least is quite inappropriate to its aims, whether that aim be the take over or considerable change in government policy. Affiliation with labor groups are out of the question since they represent another form of regional-economic interest. Farm groups, for the most part, are in the same classification. The only unaffiliated groups are those contained in the middle class who are endowed with highly technical and scientific skills. Although, like most middleclass groups whose assets are controlled by an alienated directorate, their fundamental outlook is applied towards national requirements. They also hold the one key that all federal and corporate power is based upon — their future oriented skills and ability.

The short-term or long-term plans of the new left for an adequate, appropriate and immediate change in the structure and attitude of the U.S. government toward all the major problems plaguing the environment are indeed sketchy and more times than most lacking in sophistication. Yet their constant dissent, along with other groups, has contributed to the split between Southern politicians and the rest of the national democratic party during the presidential convention of 1968. It caused the South to switch political affiliations and to create a third party while bringing to light the glaring inadequacies inherent in the idea of regional-economic interests.

What exactly should the aims of the new left encompass? This question, above all else, is one that should require an answer that favors reform and not compromise.

- 1) There should be a substantial revision in the Constitution of the United States deleting the idea of State's rights since the state has become merely an administrative branch of the federal government.
- 2) Congress should be forced to evaluate and abandon its seniority rule in bestowing committee chairmanships upon elected officials for a more equitable system leading to a fairer allocation of revenue.
- 3) A separate authority, one which would have no political affiliations with political parties should be created and elected to office by popular vote, of scientists and technicians whose job it would be to apply their full amount of technical know-how to solutions of the Nation's environmental problems.
- 4) The Federal government should enforce some sort of national planning upon corporate entities all of which produce for America's needs. This would curtail overproduction and channel the necessary capital towards products more meaningful to the national community. The scientific authority, described previously, will plan for this channeling and prescribe systems and procedures for efficient adaptation.

These four suggestions, I feel, are suitable for a modern society. The basis for all power lies within the society it serves. If the new left recognizes this power, it shall prevail.

redevelopment schemes.

The most exciting feature of the Development Committee's offerings is its alternate plan for the slum clearance and redevelopment of the Cooper Sq. area. Composed with the assistance of licensed City Planner Walter J. Thabit, the Alternate Plan grows out of a survey of the residents of this area, conducted recently with the assistance of students from Sarah Lawrence College. Many interesting data came out of this survey. It was found that nearly all residents of the area were violently opposed to the original Title I plan for Cooper Square development, which would have bulldozed the neighborhood to provide room for 2,900 units of exclusively middle-income housing. It was further found that the people here were averse to moving from the area at all, if any opportunity existed of redeveloping the neighborhood at rents they could afford. Local businessmen felt threatened by the Title I plan, which made no provision for their resettlement here or elsewhere. And the many old people here expressed bitter reluctance to the suggestion of moving to "cooperatives for the elderly," stating overwhelmingly that they enjoyed living among young people.

Acting on these data, the Development Committee drew up a program of redevelopment that will retain the identity of Cooper Square and also be flexible enough to accommodate the changes that the community is now going through. The essence of the Alternate Plan is that redevelopment should be done in stages. The present area bounded by Stanton and Fifth Streets between Second Avenue and the Bowery, for example, would be developed in two stages: the initial demolition and reconstruction would take place on vacant lots and abandoned buildings, and the present residents of this area would be moved into the new buildings before their present buildings would be razed. Into the new buildings then constructed, families from other blocks — Stanton and Delancy, perhaps — would be moved, until those blocks could be redeveloped.

The new buildings would rent out at an economic range that the present residents of the area could afford. The Plan calls for 620 units of Federal and State-aided public housing in this area, renting for from \$14 to \$20 per room; 300 apartments of Mitchell-Lama straight rental housing, renting at \$25 per room; and 520 middle-income cooperative apartments, with a buy-in of about \$650 per room at "rental" of \$25 per room. At least 20 per cent of this housing would be especially fitted for occupancy by elderly persons.

The present external appearance of the community could hardly be retained — the visual poetry of sandstone filigree, broad front stoops, tenements fire escapes overhanging the sidewalks — but the Committee insists that the architecture of the new buildings be designed with an eye toward diversity and utility, with parks and play areas and broad pedestrian pathways. The ground floors of most units will contain room for shops and markets of all sorts, and the buildings will intersperse tall structures with low structures. There will however be no stratification of tenants because of income: the public housing will be congruent in appearance with Mitchell-Lama housing and middle-income cooperatives.

Essential to retaining the fabric of any community is the preservation of the merchants in the area. The Committee has devised a seven-point program to protect the rights of Cooper Square business proprietors: compensation in full for loss of earnings from direct losses due to reconstruction and for moving expenses; prompt settlement of awards; priority to return at the original site at comparable rent; relocation services; long-term loans at low interest for new equipment and alterations; and a ninety-day, rent-free arrangement for an owner who elects to liquidate his business.

Essential to retaining the fabric of this particular community is the preservation of the artists in this area. The Cooper Square Community Development Committee rejoices in what it calls "an unusual opportunity to wed community life with the life of arts and artists." Through a series of discussions with the artists and a postcard survey of

their desires, accompanied by a physical inspection of the present facilities for artists in the community, the Committee has mapped out a pilot project for the construction of a low-cost artists' development to be erected as part of the overall development plan. It is proposed that one building be constructed specifically for artists, at rents artists can afford, containing all manner of utilities for painting, sculpturing, filming, architecture, and just plain meditative loafing. An artist's committee has been formed to work with the Development Committee, and a competition for the design of the building itself is planned.

These are the bones of the Cooper Square Community Development Committee's program. It is also urged that the area around St. Mark's Place north of Fifth St. be retained in its existing condition, since the vital center of the business community is located in this area. The Committee's overall Alternate Plan has been accepted as a guideline by the Federal Government, to be followed by any planners who apply for federal funds to develop this area. Whether it can be beaten into the head of the City Planning Commission is another question; Cooper Square is confident that it can.

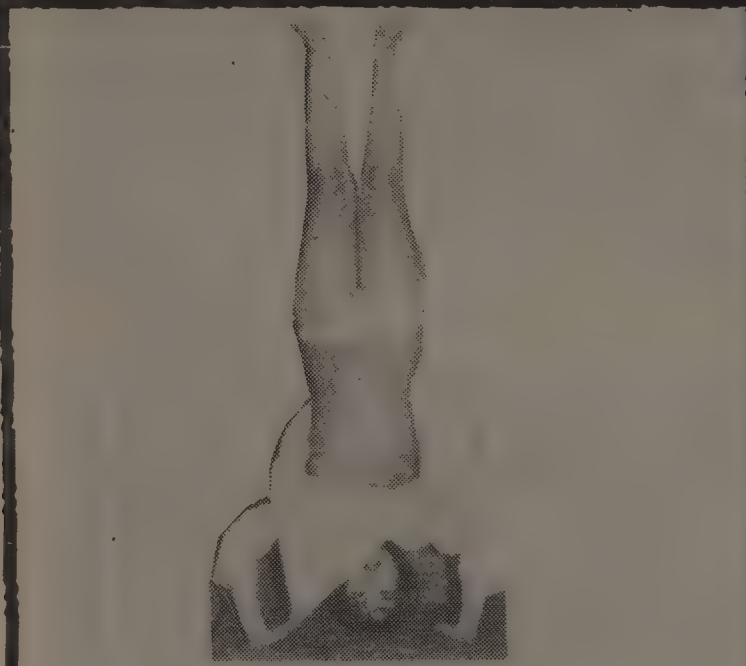
