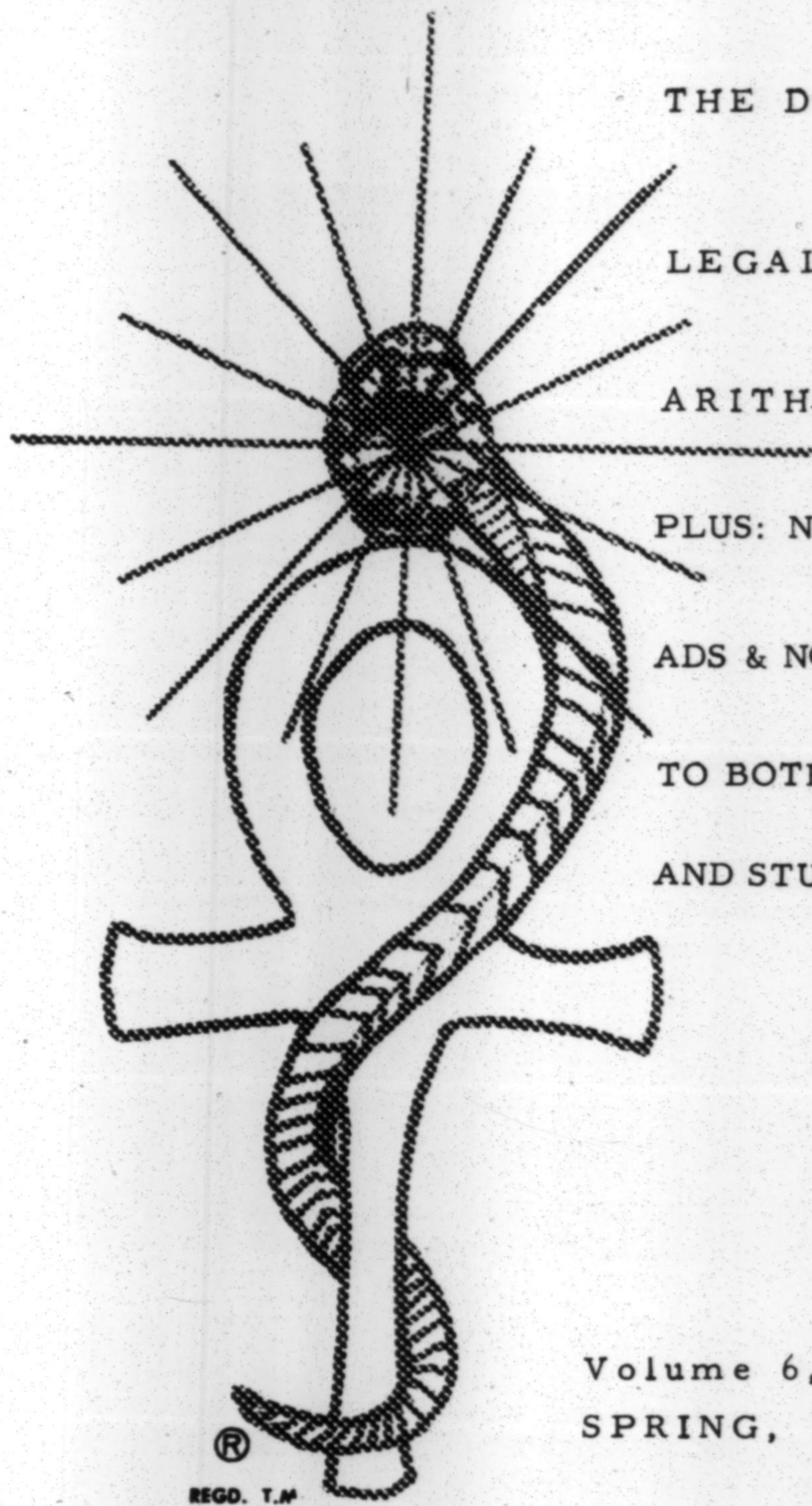



SPECIAL DIVINATION.

Besides the ancient practices of consulting Oracles or mystic sources of information whenever occasion arose to do so, there has survived the custom of obtaining forecasts on certain specific days.

The previous pages have dealt with questions and answers that are applicable to any time. The Sibylline Books of Ancient Rome or the Oracle at Delphi could be questioned whenever an emergency appeared; and so can the modern reader utilize the preceding questions and answers whenever curiosity, speculation and desire urge him.

But when special festival days occurred, it was customary to question the augurs regarding the future, even though there was no present need. Such consultations were essential ceremonies of the day. A brilliant festival, a Day of Triumph, or the birthday of a ruler would be unusually happy if the augurs predicted well. On the contrary, the glory of a great day would be dispelled if reports were heard that the augury had not been a happy one.

Through Arithmancy, or the practice of divination by numbers, anyone can to-day experiment with the customs of the ancients. The Tables of Questions and Answers that appear in the following pages are prepared for use on special days, and are independent of the Questions and Answers which have appeared before.

SPECIAL QUESTIONS FOR SPECIAL DAYS.

ANSWERED BY THE MAGIC SQUARE.

The pages that follow contain special questions for special days. These questions are varied, but can all be answered similarly.

The method of determining the answers is very simple.

First, choose your question. Then turn to the Magic Square for Special Days. Turn the book around a few times, and while you are not looking at it, touch the Magic Square. The number you touch will be your answer; and it will be found in the Table of Answers.

It makes no difference what question you ask, as the answers apply to all questions. Ask any

question you wish, and the Magic Square will give you the number of your answer.

One Table of Questions is to be used on New Year's Day. Another is intended for Birthdays; while the third can be employed on any important Holiday.

The consultant, however, can ask only one question, unless the Answer directs him or her to ask another. If a second question is asked without direction, it may not receive a correct answer. In the same way, if a question is asked on an improper day, the answer will not be reliable.

It is permissible, however, for one person to ask a question for another, if the person asking the question is serious-minded and in the proper mental attitude.

For example: if you have a friend whose birthday is October 11, you can ask a question about that friend on that day, using one of the Birthday Questions. On New Year's Day, you may ask questions about several different persons, using the New Year's Questions; and the same applies to the Holiday Questions.

In each case, the consultant who asks regarding another person should concentrate upon that person. When one asks a question about a close friend, the answer has great chances of being correct. A question asked concerning a stranger, however, may not result in an accurate answer, as the mental image used by the consultant may be imperfect in detail.

The Magic Square used in determining these answers is five by five—five being the number of speculation and adventure. The total number of squares is twenty-five; and the figures two and five total seven, producing the great Number of Mystery. This Magic Square requires more serious thought than those given earlier in the book, as it is based upon uncertain elements, and can, therefore be used only on momentous occasions.

The reader who reserves this Magic Square for use on special days, when important questions are to be asked may profit greatly thereby. Many surprising and accurate answers are contained in these replies to Special Questions.

THE DEADLY REMEDY

Two or three centuries ago, there was in vogue a medical treatment, widely practiced and greatly relied upon, of attempting to cure various ailments by "bleeding" the patient. The "science" of exsanguination was highly developed and most of the physicians of that day carried special edged instruments for the purpose of opening veins and draining out a quantity of blood. It was observed that patients who were restless, tense, feverish, or hyperative were "calmed" by this process. Frequently, persons so treated would drop off in a "peaceful sleep", from which some of them, unfortunately never awakened.

Eventually, physicians became enlightened, but who can say how many worthy human lives were sacrificed to well-intentioned, but deadly ignorance?

We have among us today those who practice an even more deadly "bleeding" of our nation's life blood. The blood they innocently and foolishly drain is the national security of the United States and indeed, the security of our Western Civilization. This bleeding takes many forms, but the most damaging and most difficult to stop is by way of the "crackpot-liberal, pseudo-intellectual, self-delusion syndrome". This malady is endemic in America, with periodic outbreaks and declines. It is most notably manifest in the ranks of our educational establishment and among those who claim political leadership of the "disadvantaged". Why these people are so susceptible to this aberration is not clear, but it seems to come from a misguided idealism combined with a compartmentation of mental processes which prevents or denies any critical analysis of facts in certain areas. Those persons so affected tend to be vigorous in their dedication to one particular issue or category of issues. These people delude themselves generally on three basic issues.

The first delusion is that the Russians and other Communists have now renounced the fundamental Communist doctrines of Marx and Lenin. This belief is held de-

spite forthright and repeated statements to the contrary by all the Communist leaders of every Communist nation. Unfortunately, this particular self-delusion leads directly to several others, including the need for the unilateral disarmament of the United States, the give-away of the Panama Canal, the sale or gift of strategic technology and industrial capacity to Communist nations, the abandonment or outright betrayal of various friendly anti-Communist nations around the world, and the need to have Communists lecture to our young people in our institutions of higher education.

The second most prevalent category of self-delusion deals with economic theory and rests upon the false premise that government can through some miracle create something from nothing! The primary spin-off from this myth is endless deficit spending and astronomical debt, both public and private. Inevitably, the result has been a serious and terribly weakening inflation, which has caused both national and personal insecurity at levels almost without precedent in our nation.

The third and perhaps most dangerous of all three of the self-delusions is that people's freedom can be protected best by taking it away from them. This delusion is based in the mistaken belief rampant among so-called "liberals" that they know better what is "good" for people than the people know themselves. These ideas are implemented through the ever-growing trend to regulate and control almost all aspects of human existence through government rules, guidelines, regulations, statutes, executive orders and dictatorial judicial decrees. This trend is evidently based in fear and insecurity. Those who suffer from this delusion generally fear the responsibilities of freedom and are insecure when not rigidly guided. They have no confidence in the concept of personal responsibility and refuse to teach it to our young people; clearly preferring the so-called security of a controlled society to the opportunities of responsible freedom.

What will be the results of these three delusions if they persist?

The result of the first will be war, for which we will not be prepared and in which we will face the horrible danger of a total loss

of our two hundred year investment in freedom.

The result of the second will be a terrible period of economic depression and deflation, precipitated by the foreign nations upon which we are economically dependent for raw materials. Eventually, these nations will simply refuse to sell us anything for worthless inflated dollar-credits.

The results of the third delusion will be a police-state society wherein the freedoms guaranteed by the Bill of Rights will have vanished like smoke on a windy day. The "security" we will then have will be the same as that enjoyed by the inmates of a prison, and the guards and wardens will be the "pseudo-intellectuals" who will themselves have lost all freedom to speak or think independently.

Can this dreary picture be changed, and if so by what means?

We are hanging over the edge of a precipice, but so long as we are able to act, we have hope of improvement through the enlightenment of our society. A delusion is notoriously difficult to cure, particularly when the deluded victim is totally dedicated to the false idea and literally terrified of seeing it destroyed. Still, it can be done, and reality can be made known.

It is the nature of free people that they do not recognize a problem until it effects them personally. Usually, they take no action regarding that problem until it becomes a personal crisis. However, that crisis is now becoming more evident each day as the American people begin to "feel the pinch" and see the threats! Our best hope is that by the time the growing crisis forces a general awareness and concern it will not be too late to repair the great damage that has already been done by the delusions.

We must remember that the message of reason which we bear is being told to a passing parade rather than an audience and it must be told over and over to new people until enough have heard it to bring the needed response. The words of Jesus Christ two thousand years ago on this problem were simple, "Seek ye the truth, and the truth shall make ye free".

Deprogrammers Are Losers in Two California Cases

LOS ANGELES—Deprogrammers were the losers in two recent cases in California.

Ted Patrick, best known of the people who attempt to remove adherents from religious groups, was indicted with seven other persons in San Diego on charges of kidnapping a young woman who belongs to the Church of Scientology.

In another case, two associates of Mr. Patrick were ordered by a federal judge in Los Angeles to pay \$10,000 to a Hare Krishna follower whom they kidnapped to deprogram.

The indictments in the Scientology deprogramming were based in part on testimony from a former Scientologist, now a vocal critic of the church, who was present at the deprogramming attempt. Nan McLean, the Scientology critic, said she was evicted by Mr. Patrick because she did not approve of holding 24-year-old Paula Jean Dain against her will.

Ms. Dain, a former model and cosmetology student, joined Scientology against the wishes of her father, Dr. Jack Dain. He and his wife, Mary, the young woman's stepmother, secured the help of Mr. Patrick and five associates to attempt to remove Paula from the group.

The indictment said Ms. Dain was held against her will for 37 days in September and October. Ms. McLean, who was present for most of the time, said Ms. Dain was fed well and was not physically abused, but the young woman was never left alone.

Ms. Dain was finally released October 8 at a Long Beach law office when she signed a release clearing her father, stepmother, and Mr. Patrick of any wrongdoing. But she did not leave the Church of Scientology and is now living with other Scientologists.

In the Hare Krishna case, Ilene I. Rothstein and Donna Grieving were ordered by U.S. District Judge David W. Williams to pay \$10,000 to Madonna Slavin Walford and the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON). Ms. Walford was 19 years old at the time of her deprogramming attempt in October, 1976.

Five members of her family, including her mother, were fined \$100 each in 1977 on misdemeanor convictions of false imprisonment. The recent judgment against the two deprogrammers prohibits them from confining Ms. Walford or any other devotee of the Hare Krishna group.

Slot-machine "Church" Loses High Court Bid

WASHINGTON, D.C.—The Southgate Chapel and recreation center in downtown Memphis, Tennessee, is out of business.

In a brief order the U.S. Supreme Court let stand a lower-court ruling affirming the conviction of Paul E. Vance, who described himself as the minister of what turned out to be a gambling establishment in the Tennessee city.

Without comment the Justices of the High Court agreed with a jury in Memphis that three years ago convicted Mr. Vance, sentenced him to a two-to-three-year sentence in the state penitentiary, and fined him \$1,000.

Mr. Vance argued throughout his lengthy appeal that the chapel and recreation center, sponsored by the so-called Christian Church of Faith, was discriminated against by Memphis police. He said that if the vice squad looked into his operation, it ought also to check out local Catholic church and Jewish synagogue bingo games.

He also said that his church was legitimate because it held services every Sunday, had a minister, held group sessions, helped drug addicts and the homeless, and gave away money to children for bus fares.

Tennessee's assistant attorney general, on the other side, argued that although the state could not subject Mr. Vance and his "church" to a "test of orthodoxy or good faith," it nevertheless "can and frequently must determine what groups and activities are religious" in the context of the First Amendment.

Lawsuit Challenges Display of Ten Commandments in Classroom

GRAND FORKS, North Dakota—A group of parents has challenged the constitutionality of a 1927 law requiring that the Ten Commandments be posted in public school classrooms.

Federal court judge Paul Benson heard oral arguments in the case in December.

Plaintiff's attorney Robert Vogel, a North Dakota law professor, said that the law "shows a governmental preference for one religion over another." But assistant North Dakota Attorney General Murray Sagsveen argued that the commandments have significance that goes beyond the religious roots of the document.

Commenting on the case in Washington, D.C., LIBERTY editor Roland R. Hegstad pointed out that Sagsveen's argument is similar to that used by the U.S. Supreme Court to legitimize Sunday laws in its 1961 decision.

"The Court did hold, however," said Hegstad, "that if a Sunday law had, on its face, in its legislative history, or in its operative effect anything of religion, the Court would take another look at it."

"Only a look at the legislative history of the 1927 legislature would reveal just what the law's supporters had in mind," he said. "But certainly the first four of the Ten Commandments leave no doubt of their religious origin and purpose. Even many churchmen have held that the contents of the first four commandments are outside the province of government."

"At the least," he concluded, "posting the commandments could lead to interesting classroom discussions—for one, Why do most churches disregard the fourth commandment, which calls on mankind to keep holy the seventh-day Sabbath? And imagine a teacher trying to stay within constitutional bounds and answer such questions as Who authored the Ten Commandments? And on whose authority are we told that they must be observed?"

The ACLU (American Civil Liberties Union) is behind this decision and has also asked the Air Force and Navy to take similar steps. An Air Force spokesman said, "Any thing that could be construed as teaching religion will be removed." (ref. Decatur, Illinois, News, July 18, 1979).

But NOTHING operates in a vacuum. So what will replace the references to God? Evidently that has all been taken care of. The University of Maryland has a contract with the Army, who sub-contracted with Sidney Simon to "clarify" the values of 12,000 soldiers in Germany! So, humanist Sidney Simon, author of Values Clarification, will be teaching the religion of humanism WITH YOUR TAX MONEY to the soldiers. So there's no room for God but plenty of room for Sidney Simon! Ask your President and Congress WHY this is true in this "one nation under God."

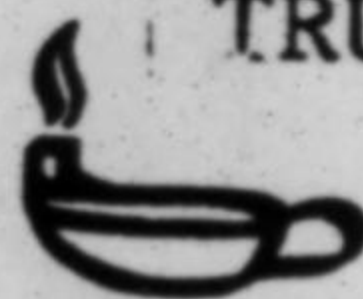

The Temple of Truth

THE TEMPLE OF TRUTH, unlike most other Orders and Magickal Lodges, is essentially *unstructured*. It has no "grades," issues no pretentious certificates, and has no fixed curriculum. The Temple of Truth exists primarily for its students and members, and hence does not get involved in the internal workings of other organizations. The Temple of Truth takes no part in political quarrels which sweep through the contemporary American Occult scene. Likewise, we abjure most of the "traditional" secrecy which all too frequently hides ineptitude and selfishness on the part of those purporting to know it all. What little is kept secret is simply for the safety of the individual student, and no information is "forever denied" to a promising student. Each individual is free to select his own course of study, as well as the rate at which he chooses to pursue it. This "independent study" concept allows the staff as well as the students considerable flexibility. The student defines what it is he wishes to do and then later submits a report on the results he has achieved. Selections from these reports may be published at a later date.

Individual students are encouraged to adopt the scholastic method but not required to do so. In any event, the lack of rigor will not bar the student from opportunities to test his theories. Empirical results are the cornerstones of the student's progress.

Flexibility is also stressed in the admission standards of the organization, the main emphasis being on a better than average moral and ethical behaviour on the part of the individual applicant. The applicant's motivation should be a desire for spiritual development rather than an egotistic craving to

be called a "High Priest" or a "High Priestess," or the lust for "Powers"—usually over others—in lieu of Self-control.

The student is encouraged to practice his magick in his own home as a part of his everyday life. This emphasis on individual practice (after an initial period of instruction) is one of the largest differences between The Temple of Truth, and other Magickal organizations operating in the present Occult spectrum. Membership in The Temple of Truth is non-exclusive, or in other words, members of other organizations can join ours. Dues are low because we are not supporting a large staff or headquarters complex.

The Temple of Truth is sponsored by The Light of Truth Church, a duly licensed and incorporated Religious Institution. The Church is neither evangelistic nor fundamentalist in the usual sense. We do proselytize the basic dignity of Man, and we recognize the subjectivity of what most people call "truth." The Church's teachings, being cabalistic, are compatible with Christian, Moslem, and Hebrew religious tenets.

Dues, donations, and so forth to either the Temple or the Church are entirely tax-exempt, under both State and Federal law.

The Church also operates a Gift and Occult Supply shop, The Magick Circle, at 1274 N. Lake Ave., Pasadena, California.


