

PAUL: Hello Russell. What I've got actually is, well I've got a story here out of Israel. Probably be easier just to read that to you fast.

RUSSELL: That would be very interesting.

PAUL: The other one is an enlargement of the paper that you had, working out projections for us. I'll try and drop a lot of the words like exclusive, and stuff for you. "Three Soviet immigrants in Israel review for the first time some of the frightening secret use of parapsychology in the USSR. One of the former Soviet Union's/top experts on parapsychology research Abraham Shiffrin, former legal advisor in the Soviet Ministry of Defense then called the Ministry of War Equipment, immigrated to Israel in 1970. After 10 years in forced labor camps in northern Siberia he was exiled to Kazakstan in 1963. On his way to exile he was summoned to Moscow and asked to work in a huge/parapsychology institute. Shiffrin, now Executive Director of the research center for concentration camps in the USSR, Tel Aviv, is collecting information about parapsychology in Russia. Much of this information is smuggled out and he's also in contact with 30 former Soviet parapsychologists now living in Israel. Shiffrin, 53, told the Enquirer about his experiences on revealing things publicly. The Soviet government and KGB are hooking up the science of parapsychology to the service of communism. The USSR has advanced many generations beyond the West in parapsychological research. A great danger is threatening the West because of the demonic ~~demonic~~ use that Soviet scientists are making in parapsychology."

RUSSELL: Because of the what use?

PAUL: ~~Demonic~~ "Demonic". In 1963 I had just finished a 10 year sentence as a

political prisoner in forced labor camps in northern Siberia and was about to begin an exile in Kazakstan. I was invited to Moscow to be the head of a parapsychology institute, Prof. Solomon Gellerstein the Director and his assistant Prof. Dimitri Mirza. They knew about my research and I had been in contact with them while I was in the forced labor camps. When I arrived at the 10-story building in Moscow I was amazed to see that it was packed with many uniform^{ed} and undercover agents. The people were working there in absolute secrecy according to the instructions of the party censors and the KGB. The institute was called the Institute of Problems and Translation of Information, IPPI. The name was a front, because it was a top secret institute and they didn't want anyone to know about their research. When I saw the sophisticated facilities of the IPPI, I was astonished. There was very advanced equipment. Researchers were conducting experiments in receiving thoughts and conversations from long distances. They were also doing experiments in transferring thoughts to others and trying to direct the actions of the subjects according to their will. I saw this with my own eyes. When Prof. Gellerstein told me to visit his home to discuss the research in more detail I understood that we were going to talk about things we couldn't discuss in his office. At his home, Prof. Gellerstein openly admitted that the IPPI was working for the KGB. He described that parapsychological research in detail. I saw even more at the IPPI. They were starting experiments in which psychics projected their energies into copper, silver and wood objects. These are very effective materials for receiving psychic energy. They call these objects batteries of power. They tested different colored objects, too, in order to determine

which colors absorbed energy best. These batteries of power were often simple-looking dolls, wooden spoons and model Sputniks. The person that handled these gifts can be affected by the energy that was projected into it. For example, if someone is a decision maker, the object could make him mentally weak and indecisive."

RUSSELL: Incredible! Have you every heard of anything like that?

PAUL: Voodoo dolls.

RUSSELL: I suppose.

PAUL: "After I was allowed to immigrate from the USSR in 1970 I traveled in Europe and the US and I've seen these type of Soviet souvenirs that in the possession of high government officials. I think/these objects have some type of influence over those who handle them." In the brackets it says see interview files of Raphael Zeidoveski for backup.

RUSSELL: Raphael who?

PAUL: Zeidoveski. It's on the back of "The IPPI had people trained in clairvoyance who used their abilities in experiments to predict troop maneuvers. For example, a military maneuver was staged where soldiers in one military base were supposed to capture soldiers from an enemy base hidden across the river. The psychic working for the IPPI was brought to the base. He instructed the chief of staff exactly where and when to attack the enemy soldiers. The soldiers surprised the enemy, who were swimming in the river. The IPPI conducted experiments in the chemical aspects of psychic phenomena. They learned, for example, that when a person sends thoughts at a distance the amount of adrenaline in his blood increases. Meanwhile, the person who's receiving the thoughts, there's a decrease in his adrenaline level. The Ippi tried to

increase psychic powers by injecting adrenaline into a number of senders and giving depressants to the receivers. The Soviet government sends people to research centers in the west to learn the latest parapsychological research. They bring information and materials back to the Soviet Union. The military and the KGB give full encouragement and support to psychic research. The Central Committee of the Communist Party, the central power in the USSR, ^{attaches} / such importance to parapsychology that they invited the top three physicists in the USSR, Prof. Lev Tummerman, Igo Thom and Glev Frank to serve communism by setting up the IPPI. Tummerman was such a prestigious scientist that he was allowed to refuse; anyone else would have been afraid to say no." (A note here that we have an interview with Tummerman). "Breshnev is walking around in public surrounded by guards. His only weapon is their brains. These guards are capable of reading the thoughts of people in crowds. The head of these special guards is Wolfgang Messing, ~~whose~~ ^{whose} chief was Stalin's guard. Messing works for the KGB and has astonishing psychic powers. He uses these powers as a weapon. The IPPI studied the possibility of using the psychic weapon of long-distance killing by means of thoughts only. They brought Tibetan priests to the Institute, who were able to crack the back of a skull by means of thought alone. Prof. Gellerstein offered me a very tempting position at the IPPI, but after I learned more about their activities, I refused their offer, even though it meant going back to exile in Kazakstan. I agreed, however, to remain in connection with them. Prof. Gellerstein provided some notes that put me in contact with researches who worked for him in Kazakstan and they sent me material. The Soviet government searches for psychics all over the country.

For example, they even recruit students. They give students special questionnaires which test their psychic abilities. Those that show promise are given further tests and a few are tested in the labs for photographic memory, clairvoyance and the ability to go out of their bodies at will. The IPPI asked me to investigate certain psychics and check their abilities. For instance, they asked me to meet a medical doctor in Kazakstan who they heard showed great clairvoyant abilities. She accurately described a top secret missile site which is 500 km from her home. After I sent my report about it to Prof. Gellerstein, Prof. ^{Keldysh(?)} Kelvish, Head of the Soviet Academy of Sciences, flew to Kazakstan to meet her. From the Soviet immigrants that I've been interviewing in Israel, I've learned that because of security the IPPI is now broken up into small other branches which are scattered in many cities throughout the USSR. This way, researchers at one lab do not know what the other labs are testing. At my research center in Tel Aviv we are receiving unofficial reports from friends and associates in the USSR, and we know that psychic research is continuing to very fast and sophisticated levels. I think it's important to speak out and warn people about the way the USSR is using psychic power for political and military purposes. I know they're doing advanced work in telepathy and ^Uclairvoyance and maybe they'll be able to use psychics to read reports going on inside the Pentagon and the White House. Terrible things are happening today in the USSR. The Soviet experts in the West don't understand what's taking place. They're too busy cutting out old newspaper clippings to find out what's really happening. Psychic researchers in the West are still doing very simple tests and are wasting precious time deciding

whether psychic phenomena exist at all. The uses of psychic
could be
energy / more important than the discovery of atomic energy.
Militarily, it can be more powerful than the atom bomb. Raphael
Zeidoveski worked for three years as a researcher in parapsychology
at the Institute in Moscow. In January of '74 he immigrated to
Israel and is now working as a research assistant in biophysics at
the world famous Weissman Institute in R . He told the
Enquirer about the research at the laboratory of physiology in
Moscow. While as a student at Moscow University I joined a group
of students interested in parapsychology. In 1969 some of us
visited the Department of Psychiatry for Academic Medical Sciences
at the so-called Laboratory of Physiology in Moscow. When we told
the researchers at the Institute that we were interested in
conducting research in parapsychology, they let us work there.
This Institute was very actively testing for psychics and we
conducted preliminary tests on people, looking for psychic aptitudes.
We were encouraged to test as many people as possible. Thousands
of people passed through the Institute during my three years there.
We were even sent out to villages to look for psychics. They
encouraged us to search for some of the famous Russian witches, because
it was their conjecture that these witches were actual psychics.
I got first-hand information about Soviet parapsychological research.
I conducted many experiments myself. Spent many hours talking to
researchers. I was in the information network. I heard about all
the latest parapsychological research. The parapsychology institute
in the USSR are secret and this means their primary purpose is
military. They're given billions or rubles for research, but no
research is ever published except for a few articles in *Scientific*

magazines. Every year I worked at the Institute, I got more and more involved in the research. Finally I was offered a full-time position. As time went on, I also realized that our research was under the surveillance of the KGB and had military applications for evil use. It became like the first circle of hell when I discovered the uses for our research and why the KGB was interested in it. In some experiments we conducted, psychics charged all sorts of objects with their energy. We put these objects in rabbits and plants and studied how they responded to objects charged with positive and negative energies. For instance, we had psychics working for the Institute who would direct and happy emotions to stones. Then in double blind experiments we took stones charged with negative and positive emotions and placed them in the pots of plants. The plants had numbers on them and we researchers didn't know which stone was charged with which emotion. We check tested all kinds of stones, minerals, semi-precious stones, etc., to determine which ones affected the plant's growth the best. I was in charge of the statistics of these experiments and all the results of the experiments went through me. I saw absolutely conclusive proof that these experiments were successful. It is possible to charge objects with evil or good energies. And it is a fact that some of these charged objects were given to foreign officials. At the Institute I learned about experiments with a telepathic Carl ~~Nikolayev~~ Nikolayev Kamenskiy, and Uri ~~Kamenskiy~~ Kamenskiy, who are probably the best mind readers in the world. These two were able to just about establish telepathic communication while one was in Moscow and the other in Novosibirsk. In one experiment ~~Nikolayev~~ Nikolayev and ~~Kamenskiy~~ Kamenskiy used a dot and dash system like Morse code to communicate. It worked almost without fail. They transferred the first word telepathically

from over distance. This word was mig, which means moment in Russian and it was sent from Moscow to Novosibirsk. An experiment from Novosibirsk to Leningrad. In another experiment a third psychic tried to intercept communication between ~~Nikolayev~~ and ~~Kamenskii~~ ^{Kamenskiiy}. He was sitting in a city between Moscow and Novosibirsk, and he received the message correctly. This and other experiments proved that distance doesn't matter in telepathy."

RUSSELL: That's pretty exciting.

PAUL: Yeah, really.

RUSSELL: I think it's Novosibirsk. You ought to check that.

PAUL: OK, we'll run that by anyway. This is the first copy. "This and other experiments proved that distance doesn't matter in telepathy. The results were the same in thoughts sent from room to room as experiment from Moscow to Novosibirsk. In a famous ~~Kamenskiiy~~ ^{Kamenskiiy} imagined that he was beating ~~Nikolayev~~ ^{Nikolayev}. ~~Nikolayev~~ didn't know that ~~Kamenskiiy~~ ^{Kamenskiiy} was sending him this thought. ~~Nikolayev~~ ^{Nikolayev} was connected to EEG and other scientific monitoring devices and when he received ~~Kamenskiiy's~~ ^{Kamenskiiy's} thoughts the devices recorded a rise in blood pressure and his adrenaline level. He also got a headache and nausea. These experiments were done under strict laboratory conditions. Tests in the Institute showed that under hypnosis person reveal his psychic abilities better. All of us who worked in the Institute were encouraged to test our potential psychic abilities. Those who showed high aptitudes were sent outside Moscow to a special KGB school for clairvoyants. My friend Hella was a student who worked at the Institute with me. She showed some strong natural psychic abilities. As she developed her abilities she started going to the Institute more frequently. Finally she

stopped talking about her work with us. Suddenly she disappeared completely. We couldn't find her at Moscow University or anywhere in town. We knew about the special KGB school for developing clairvoyance and we concluded that Hella had been taken there. The Institute was actively conducting research on telepathic hypnosis to [inaudible] establish psychic rapport. I am very scared about this research because it could be a very powerful weapon if used in negative ways. At the Institute, we studied the possibilities of hypnotizing the person telepathically at a great distance without his knowing it. If he (?) is suggestible he can receive hypnotic suggestion which can reinforce something he already has in his mind. The possibilities are horrible. Imagine a few powerful psychics sitting in Moscow sending suggestions to Jimmie Carter. Parapsychology is a secret Soviet weapon. Why would you need an atom bomb if you could make Jimmie Carter do what you want. Clairvoyance has definite military applications. If you can see what's on the desks at the Pentagon or know what is said in Jimmie Carter's briefing, the possibilities are incredible. Uses of parapsychology could be apocalyptic in the full sense of the word. The uses could be shocking and evil. Abraham Shiffrin was one of the biggest experts on parapsychology in the Soviet Union. He had direct contact with the heads of the IPPI. Shiffrin knows the danger of Soviet psychic weapons because he was in the inner circle. What the Americans are doing can't be compared to what I saw in the USSR. Everything that the West has written about parapsychology was in the library in our Institute. The Soviet Union is running a psychic/and are winning it. Prof. Lev Tunnerman, former head of the bioenergetics laboratory at the

Institute of Molecular Biology in Moscow and member of the prestigious Soviet Academy of Sciences, immigrated to Israel in 1972. He is now professor emeritus at bioenergetics at the Weissman Institute in R , Israel. In an interview, Dr. Dar revealed in 61 or 62, Prof. Igo Tant a Nobel Prize winner / in theoretical physics and Prof. Glev Frank director of the Biophysics Institute in Moscow, member of the Academy of Sciences, and a prominent member of the Communist Party and I were invited to a meeting. We didn't even know what the building was, but we suspected it was the scientific section of the Central Committee of the Communist Party or else a KGB office. He goes through a whole rigamarole here about security. At the Institute, a budget of 10 million rubles, as large a staff as they wanted.

RUSSELL: In Moscow?

PAUL: Yes. This is in 61 or 62.

RUSSELL: Paul, what's going to happen to this report that you're reading to me.

PAUL: Well, I'll xerox a copy for you.

RUSSELL: I would be very grateful if you would. Now, can the Enquirer run such a detailed story?

PAUL: No, they won't in fact. They'll run some of it.

RUSSELL: It's too good for them.

PAUL: Do you think? I don't know, they'll just cut it down. And redigest it.

RUSSELL: I see. You're not allowed to free lance that elsewhere.

PAUL: No, not really, no. It would be for information only. This is just one, I've got one as well with projections from people that....., you know.

RUSSELL: "If you could xerox that it would be extremely helpful to me.

I'm going to be talking with these guys in Japan.

PAUL: Do you have a mailing address there?

RUSSELL: No. I'd rather you sent it to me here and that way it will
at least get somewhere.

PAUL: Today is Wednesday. It won't get there before you leave.

RUSSELL: No, but Hal could forward it to me. What's the deadline on

PAUL: Oh, pretty soon, really.
