VERY FEW PEOPLE REALLY APPRECIATE NELSON-WORDS, BUT THOSE THAT DO FREQUENTLY GO THROUGH THE CEILING. THERE EXISTS THEREFORE A WELL-DEFINED MARKET OF THE PLAYFULLY SUPER-LITERATE.
